



GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"From silly devotions and sourfaced saints, good Lord, deliver us!" St. Teresa of Avila

We've all heard the adage, "Laughter is the best medicine." In many ways, it really is. When was the last time you really laughed? The gift of imagination allows us to see possible things that are yet to be. Imagine a world filled with laughter. We take life too seriously sometimes. Fear, uncertainty, pressure, negativity, disappointment, and myriad other human experiences can rob us of the joy needed for laughter. God never promised us an easy road, and we do have to take the course of our lives seriously. However, there is a balance to be sought and a possible joy that can be brought even to the darkest and most challenging of encounters.

St. Therese of Lisieux reminds us that, "Joy is not found in the material objects surrounding us but in the inner recesses of the soul. One can possess joy in a prison cell as well as in a palace." Falling in love with God, who is present in all of creation, allows us to bring a depth of understanding to everything we do and experience. We can more easily see above and beyond things



while pursuing the only One who can truly satisfy our hearts. When we realize that God, the king of Israel, is in our midst and with us, there is no further misfortune to fear. We can celebrate the wonder and beauty of God's gift of joy. It is no wonder that many saints radiate joy and have no reservations expressing laughter. They are happy because they have found a pearl of great price.

We celebrate with joy today with hearts filled with expectation, wonder, awe, and beauty as we ready ourselves, even more excitedly, for the coming of our Savior. Do not fear and

do not be discouraged. If you haven't laughed in a while, why? Something is preventing you from expressing the magnificence of your soul and the presence of God who dwells within. God's power and presence within us assures us that we are loved and kept in that presence. What more is really needed? Rejoice and laugh in the presence of God! It really is the best medicine and a most perfect way to convince others that God is really with us. "Go ahead, laugh! Live your life with joy and serve the Lord with laughter! THE WELL THAT NEVER DRIES UP

Depending on how your mood is today, the words of Paul will hit you differently. "Rejoice always," he tells us. Well, if your football team is poised to win this weekend or next, maybe you're really feeling this vibe. But if you've got a long slog at work ahead of you this week and a to-do list that only seems to grow and never shrink, it may make you grumble. "Rejoice always? Always? When I'm tired? Cranky? When I'm sick of doing and giving? Thanks, Paul. I'll be sure to scribble that phrase on a Post-It and stick it to my dashboard for when some entitled punk inevitably cuts me off on tomorrow's morning commute."

When we feel this way, we know it's time to head back to the well. Think of all the places

in Scripture where God compares His love, His mercy, His salvation to water. And not just any water — living water, water that moves. God's strength is not a stagnant puddle sure to evaporate and disappear. It's water you can keep coming back to. It's water that never dries up.

Which is good news for us, because we never stop failing to do what we should, never stop failing to feel the joy and the compassion and the selflessness we are called to. We need a source of living water if we are going to 'rejoice always.' To be everyday stewards, we need a well that never empties.

The fountain of salvation never dries up. There is always more there for us to draw from. It's a sign of His commitment — so let us, in turn, be committed to Him.

WHAT IS HOLY WATER AND HOW DO I EXPLAIN THE REASON THAT IT IS PLACED AT THE ENTRANCES OF CHURCHES TO MY NON-CATHOLIC FRIENDS?

Holy water is a sacramental, a reminder of the life of the Church expressed and celebrated through the sacraments. God's grace is mediated through word and gesture (the outward signs). This comes to us through Jesus (instituted by Christ) as he entrusts to the Church his saving mission (to give grace). In turn the Church, through the sacraments, shares that grace and mission with us.

On Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes on our foreheads to remind us of our origins, humbly created from the dust. But by blessing ourselves with holy water, we are reminded of our destiny! We are baptized sons and daughters of God. This is also a call to conversion, to live more fully our baptismal call to live as disciples of Jesus. We see holy water whenever we renew our baptismal promises. This will occur during

the Easter liturgy as well, reminding us that we are indeed on a journey of faith and renewed in Christ. Blessing ourselves with holy water reminds us that we are baptized into a community faith, and always in need of turning from sin and toward God. Holy water is a visible sign of our baptism!





Due to the ongoing impacts of COVID-19 in our communities, we are facing an immediate need for blood donations. Many blood drives have had to canceled, which has led to a dramatic drop in blood donations in recent weeks. In our efforts to keep the shelves filled with blood at our hospitals, Versiti Blood Center will be sending all donors a \$15 e-gift card as a token of appreciation in helping us save lives in our community.

Who benefits from blood donation?

At Versiti Blood Center of Illinois, formerly Heartland Blood Centers, we never forget the patients who receive the blood we collect. Every unit of blood is collected from volunteer donors who meet specific criteria and have been screened according to strict guidelines. Every unit (pint) is collected, transported, tested and stored according to tightly-controlled procedures.

Examples of transfusion needs are:

- Cancer: up to 8 units/month
- Bone Marrow Transplant: up to 2 units/day
- Liver Transplant: up to 100 units
- Auto Accident: up to 50 units
- Cardiovascular Surgery: 2-25 unit

Deacon's Corner

For the past two Sundays, the first and second message to our lives. And while most are simple to Sundays of Advent, my homily was based on two things; preparation and expectation. Preparation for the celebration of the Incarnation (birth) of Our Lord and Savior on Christmas Day and expectation of His Second Coming. In today's DC, I want to talk more about His Second Coming. I feel so much hoopla is given about Christmas, although not necessarily the right kind of hoopla, there is little discussion or thought regarding the Second Coming of Christ when He will return to separate the goats from the sheep.

So I ask this question; "ARE YOU READY FOR HIS SECOND COMING?" And when I ask this question, please understand that it is one that I believe should be considered to be very serious. You might ask why or maybe not. The biggest challenge I see in "being ready" is our own personal commitment to Christ. Just look around. There are so many distractions and so much chaos in our society that pull us away from "being ready". In order to "be ready", we must live in the State of Grace and in order to do that we must be free of sin.

The Season of Advent gives us the opportunity to be free of sin by using the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The challenge we all have is to remain free of sin after having them forgiven. As I have said so many times in the past; "easier to say, harder to do". But we must continue to try to remain in the State of Grace. Not for a day or two, not for a while during the week, not when we are in Church on Sunday, but at all times.

There are so many references in the Bible about "being ready". They are told in parables which are nothing more than stories that we must come to discern in our own ways in order to apply their

understand, many of us seem to interpret them to suit our own lifestyle. But no matter how we interpret them, the end result should always be consistent with Christ's teachings, that we should always "be ready" for His Second Coming.

Think about ourselves as I often do. Do we keep ready all the time? Are we prepared for that day which no one knows, the day that is not on any calendar we have, to meet Jesus Christ and answer for our life here on earth? I know that I try to be, but I also know that we are all human. That the evil one lurks around each of us every day, every minute, always trying to move us into the darkness with him. To pull us out of the light where we reside with Our Lord. We all know that it is not easy to fight off the temptations of this world, but we must continue to

I know all who are reading this believe that He is coming back and we know He is giving all sinners time to repent and turn to Him, for Christ is allforgiving. All we have to do is ask with a contrite heart. I say this because sin is increasing and love for our fellow man is decreasing.

If you are a child of God, you have nothing to be concerned about. This message should not frighten the believer since we know that Christ "has gone away to prepare a place for us". And when He returns, He will take back those who believe in Him. And while I know this message isn't the most popular, we need to "be ready" for His Coming, we need to proclaim Jesus is real, and we need to "be ready" by continuing to live in the State of Grace at all times.


