THE DAYS ARE COMING

Separation, isolation, and hostility are terrible things. We are, sadly, too familiar with all of them in our modern life, whether we look at world events or events in our own neighborhoods and families. All three readings today refer to these same sad human conditions.

The prophet Jeremiah describes world conditions as if the people of his time were sheep who had been scattered by poor leadership and corrupt shepherds. But "the days are coming," he assures us (Jeremiah 23:5), when a new shepherd, a just king, will come. We meet that king in the second reading and the Gospel. Paul reminds us in the Letter to the Ephesians that all divisions can now cease in Christ Jesus, who has brought us together through his blood. In Mark's Gospel we see Jesus himself, looking with pity on those searching for him as if they were sheep without a shepherd. copyright (c) J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

There's an ordinary pine grove located on a tree farm not too far from town where life's stresses and demands seem to melt away. It is here that all that seemed so important out there no longer is and one can get lost in the rows of trees and majestic beauty. God is here and all is good. We need to connect with the Divine Source of all that is in order to understand what it is we are doing and why we are doing it. Otherwise, things stop making sense and bitterness can overcome one's spirit. It's okay to play once in a while and to discover that place of profound life and peace. People always have needs and there is constantly something to do. And while all of that is necessary and we are needed, there is also that inner solitude within that needs to be celebrated and released.

We all need a pine grove. It's that little place we can go and leave all that consumes us behind. It's a place where technology can be set aside and wonder, and awe given some time. We don't have to text, calculate, or orchestrate anything in the pine grove. It is a somewhat deserted place where



all of that can be set aside and we can just be. The anger, frustration, exhaustion, discouragement, helplessness, and occasional apathy, all can fall to the ground like all of those pine needles that once held their place on the branch of a Frasier Fir. The needles can let go. We can let go. We are beings connected with Being and we all need to remember what really matters, who really matters and what life is truly all about. We need to find that place where we can rest and let go of all of the barnacles we accumulate. Rest, breathe, seek, and love.

The world will need us again when we leave the pine grove. It will all be waiting for us, beckoning for our attention. But we will have prayed and will have marveled at the silence and the beauty of goodness. We can go back, ready, and eager to listen, to help, to heal, to cry, to embrace, and attend to all that is asked of us. But, having let go of the distractions in that deserted place we will have a renewed sense of purpose. We will know better Who it is we serve and what we are meant to do. It will all be clearer now that we have been Divinely touched and refreshed.

THE STEWARD'S WORK IS NEVER DONE

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock! When you hear these strong words from the Old Testament, you're probably thinking, thank goodness I don't have any sheep — dodged that bullet. Nobody misled here! No flock scattered on my watch! However, we are all shepherds of a kind, called to tend our own sheep: our families, our parishes, our communities.

But it's exhausting. Don't we all sometimes just want to take a break from being a steward? The excuses are so familiar: we're tired, we've done enough, we've given all we can, what more does the parish (or my spouse, or my kids, or my boss, or my friends, or my community) want? We give ourselves permission to be selfish. So, what if the flock scatters just a little?

Jesus gets that. We can just imagine him weary with exhaustion, can't we? We see him on his boat, attempting to sneak away for a quick break — maybe just a chance to eat a bite of food in peace. He is God, but he was still human, after all. Even the most dedicated shepherds need to sleep. But people couldn't leave him alone. They were hungry for him. They needed what he could offer, and they needed it now.


As tough as it is, that's the example we are tasked with imitating. Everyday Stewardship demands accountability. It demands our showing up even when we are tired. It demands that we look at our lives, our time, our energies, our talents, our hearts, our bank accounts and think: where do I still have more to give?

As human beings, we are both spiritual and corporeal. We are body and soul. This makes us unique in all creation. 1 hope everyone enjoyed the long Holiday weekend. great question comes up; "how do we overcome the The extra time off gave me some extra time to consider constant temptation to disobey the teachings of Our Lord a topic for today's DC. In thinking about it, I came up with and Savior". the thought of "do we practice what we preach".

This is an interesting phrase that we have all heard most or all of our lives. I can't speak for anyone else, but speaking from my own perspective, I know that I have slipped time and time again in doing this. And this can apply to so many aspects of our lives. But let's focus on one specific area and that is being a good Christian. How many of us call ourselves good Christians, but in reality we are not since we stray so many times from following the teachings of Our Lord and Savior.

I know it is easy to speak the words of being a good Christian, to tell our children, spouses, friends, even ourselves how we should live, but putting those words into practice and following them on a daily basis, every day, 365 days a year, is not always easy. Perhaps you remember in a Deacon's Corner past, I talked about the "evil one" and our "guardian angel". One sitting on our left shoulder and one on our right always whispering in our ear to do what they wanted. The "evil one" preaches bad or evil and our "guardian angel" tells us to do what is right in the eyes of the Lord. In the end we listen to one or the other in all instances, but I know from my own experience, the final decision is not always the correct one.

So what causes us to listen to the "one" on our left shoulder, the "evil one"? Why would we consider not doing the right and correct thing told to us by our "guardian angel" on our right shoulder? Why would we stray from the teachings of Our Lord and Savior, even when we know it is wrong to do so? I believe the answer lies in the fact that we are human, that we are sinners (yes, we all are) and that God has given us free will to make our own decisions. So the

This is a tough question to answer but as I have gotten older, I have come to realize that our salvation is not something we can achieve on our own. That is why Jesus Christ called upon the Holy Spirit to come down on His last days on earth to empower His disciples to "go out and teach ye all nations". And just like He had the Holy Spirit empower His disciples, the Holy Spirit is with us always to empower us every day to be better Christians, to live our lives following the teachings of Our Lord and Savior thereby keeping us in the State of Grace so we can enter the Kingdom of God when our days on this earth are over. Remember, all good things are available to us always through our relationship with God. And while all the roads of our lives have different potholes and curves, all roads lead to the same place. That is the Heavenly Kingdom which we all strive so hard to attain. And all we have to do when we hit one of those potholes or find a curve in life too hard to navigate is to ask God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

"Practicing what we preach" is not easy by any means. We live in such a challenging society that sometimes we are almost afraid to do what we know is "right" for fear of outside retribution. That is a terrible fear to have to live with, but that is why Our Lord who is our "partner in faith" should be used by all of us whenever we are in need and willing to do what is right. So from this day forward, let us all work on "practicing what we preach" and I assure you not only will all those around you feel better, but most importantly, we will all feel better about ourselves and our journey of life on our way to Eternal Salvation.




