

DISCIPLESHIP'S COSTS

In today's first reading, God tells the prophet Elijah to prepare Elisha to succeed him. Succeeding Elijah will be no easy task; he has spent his life facing threats from the kings he has confronted about their infidelity to the God of Israel. The psalm illustrates the emotional and spiritual distress that the prophets' steadfast faithfulness to God brought them. Paul's description of the Christian's freedom from the law as opposed to "the desire of the flesh" puts this struggle at the very heart of Christian identity. The reading from Luke's Gospel recounts Jesus' decision to journey toward Jerusalem, where he knows he will meet his earthly fate. Following Jesus—like succeeding Elijah as prophet—will now become more difficult. Unlike his calls to the first disciples, Jesus encounters those who are not ready or are not strong enough to journey with him.

And to another he said, "Follow me." In every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling us. We can easily get distracted and not hear it or simply ignore it, pretending it wasn't even heard. When we do hear it and favorably respond, there are some conditions that must be met. Jesus makes it clear that once we say yes to his invitation, we must stay focused and forge ahead. We cannot keep looking behind or worry about unfinished business. There are some tasks, and discipleship is one, that require our full devotion.

There are many "masters" vying for our attention. We need something or someone to give us direction. Human nature requires it. Our motives and actions reveal what has our allegiance. It is tempting to give ourselves to masters that lure us with intriguing promises. When given the choice between a "master" that promises worldly success, abundant wealth, status, privilege, and security versus a "master" that asks for self-sacrifice. hardship, suffering, ridicule, and death, to whom do we go? While the promise of immediate pleasure is enticing, there is always a catch. For all that secular



masters can promise, they always keep us looking behind, checking on ourselves, second guessing choices, calculating options, and being slaves to excessive worry. Our guard can never come down. Only one master really promises life: Jesus Christ. Hearing his call, we either trust him or we don't.

Saying yes to following Christ does come with a risk. But it also comes with the brightness of future hopes and dreams. There is no need to keep looking behind. Sins are forgiven and regrets serve no effective purpose. God is not there. He's moved beyond

all that stuff. God is in the today and the tomorrow and what he can continually do with our daily affirmation to follow Him. All we need to do is be obedient. St. Gianna Molla is credited with saying, "The stillness of prayer is the most essential condition for fruitful action. Before all else, the disciple kneels down." Begin with prayer. We will not only hear God's call but find the courage to trust that He will guide us where we need to be. God uses us in the most ordinary of ways through the simple daily expression of our lives.

And another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home." To him Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." - Lk 9:61-62



I have seen the title of Vicar General and Chancellor used in our Catholic newspaper. Who are they and what do they do?

A bishop is in charge of a diocese and appoints people to help with its administration. Two of those positions are the Vicar General and the Chancellor. Both play a role in the life of a diocese, despite the many jokes priests may tell at their expense! A chancellor is the archivist of a diocese, charged with task of keeping the records of the diocese. Often a bishop may add other responsibilities and the chancellor may end up being like the executive director of the diocesan office. The chancellor does not need to be a priest.

The vicar general is a priest, appointed by the bishop and acts in the name of the bishop in administering the diocese. He has an advanced degree in canon law or theology. He also has executive authority within the diocese. This means that he is involved in the day-to-day pastoral and temporal administration of the diocese. Canon law does not allow a bishop to appoint a relative to the position, nor the priest in charge of the sacrament of penance. In both cases, the purpose of the law is to avoic conflicts of interest.



JUNE 21, 2022 Deacon's Corner

e are two days past Father's Day occurring, but if you are like me, Father's Day is every day. You might ask; "Deacon John, what do you mean by that?" Well, you are correct, I am going to tell you.

In the homily I gave at Sunday's Mass, which was based on the Gospel of Lk 9: 11-17, I spoke about one of my most famous miracles that Jesus performed. It was the miracle of the loaves and fishes. I am sure you recall that Jesus disciples wanted to dismiss the large crowd since they were far from home in a deserted area and had nothing to eat. Jesus told them to have the people sit down and took five loaves of bread and two fish and blessed them and multiplied them into enough food to feed the five thousand men (recall that while there were no women or children mentioned in the Gospel, they were still among the crowd). And when all had eaten to their fill, the disciples gathered up what was left and filled twelve wicker baskets. The enormity of God's love for His people is something to always remember.

Mother Teresa said about Jesus; "He uses us to be His love and compassion in the world in spite of our weaknesses and frailties". Yes, we are all human but with the "help of God", we all have the ability to call on the Holy Spirit to help us at any and all times in our own time of need. The people who followed Jesus were hungry, and He fed them. Think what He can do for us starting from the beginning when He instilled the Holy Spirit, the third Person of the Blessed Trinity on His disciples (and us since we are all His disciples). The message Jesus is giving us is simple. NO MATTER HOW LITTLE WE THINK WE HAVE TO GIVE, ONCE WE FREELY PLACE OUR FAITH AND TRUST IN GOD, OUR FATHER, THE GIFTS WE GIVE HAVE LIMITLESS POTENTIAL.

This past Sunday, we celebrated the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, or the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In many ways we are like the Gospel crowd as we are also followers of Jesus Christ. We come daily with our hopes and needs to encounter Jesus. Remember, Jesus has created a Eucharistic world where we can experience His real presence and the hope of something better for in receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist, no heart goes hungry, we are given the bread of life.

That is why I said in my homily how important it is to be here in Mass at the altar of sacrifice. The pandemic has given us the ability to stay at home and fulfill our duty by watching Mass on TV. I have urged everyone to "get back to Church, even if it is only on Sunday". I believe it is most important to receive the "real presence" of Our Lord in the Eucharist and we can only do that by attending Mass.

God, our Father, in His infinite wisdom and compassion, has given us and will continue to give us all the opportunity to remain one with Him. He gives us this each and every day, so why do we not take advantage of His loving kindness? Sometimes I think we listen to the evil one on our left shoulder telling us to keep our distance from the Father. 
We have a serious replacement/repair situation that has come up and we need your help!

On June 3 to 5, the deacons of the Archdiocese of Chicago gathered to celebrate 50 years of diaconate in Chicago. There were keynote presentations, workshops and Pentecost Sunday Mass was celebrated by 3 bishops. It was a joyful gathering of hundreds of deacons, and their wives.

In 1972, 90 men were ordained deacons in the first class. It took 5 ordination Masses to ordain them all. Two men from our parish, Fritz Bertagnoli and Bill Krueger, were ordained in that class as deacons to serve our parish.

Chicago currently has more ordained deacons than any other diocese in the world. Deacons are ordained to serve the church and the people. The deacon is expected to serve others, and has a special role in proclaiming the Gospel at Mass.

The formation program for deacons is 4 years and includes a variety of topics, such as preaching, liturgy, bible study, praying with others, leading funerals and weddings and performing baptisms. Deacons are often married, and their wives join them for some of the formation classes. If you are interested, contact any of our 3 deacons at St. Francis. If you know someone who would make a good deacon, encourage them to ask some questions.

WHO IS OUR LADY OF FATIMA?

Mary continued to appear once a month for 6 months to the three children, Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco. In October of 1930, the Bishop of Leiria-Fátima approved the visions as "worthy of belief." Our Lady of Fatima urgently desired for all of faithful to pray daily for the salvation of poor sinners, and for the whole world. That message from Our Mother Mary is a challenge – no matter where you are in your own personal prayer life – to go deeper, to pray often, and with greater fervor.






