



#### **BEARING FRUIT**

Few of us, even when we meditate on the image of the vine and branches, stop to really think about how God "prunes" us. For some there is the danger of thinking that we are already producing fruit for the kingdom, in deed and truth as John says, perhaps raising a family, being active in our parish, and so on. But even those branches which are bearing fruit, the Gospel tells us, can be pruned to produce still more. Today Saul, freshly "pruned" by his conversion, arrives in Jerusalem and meets resistance. Since he had been persecuting Christians, this was only natural. But even after he is accepted and begins to bear fruit, he meets further adversity, and his letters are filled with many accounts of how his trials "pruned" him to produce greater fruit for the kingdom. Like him, as long as we remain in Christ we will continue to bear fruit and, when the will of the Father determines it is time to prune us, the strength of the true vine must enable us to endure it. copyright (c) J. #### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

#### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"Spiraling out of control," is a phrase that can easily describe the current display of human existence. In addition to the violence, unrest, uneasiness and turmoil that are common elements of our daily news, other essential pieces are misplaced or missing. Many lack an objective center around which to order and structure their lives or a clear set of definable goals or mores to act as guideposts and life directives. It appears that "feelings" have become a "new god" and traditional structures and ideals set aside. It is almost as if history only shows that we got this whole thing wrong and many are determined to finally set things right. The real truth, however, is that while wrongs and errors are certainly a part of our oftencheckered past, it is hardly the case that all was wrong. It is not our task to rewrite the history of our lives, but to learn from mistakes that were made, and preserve the perennial wisdom at the root of our successes. Learning is an essential part of being human.

The question becomes, however, from whom do we learn? Some have such a hard time placing God in that position, but that is precisely where God needs to be. God is the Master Teacher from whom all of humanity learns and gets its cues. It is in and through this relationship with the Gardener of Life that we



are fashioned and pruned into the people we are intended to be and can be. It is only in God that we are able to find our best selves. Sadly, many think that religion too, as well as history in general, has also gotten all this wrong. Yet, our resurrection faith tells us differently. We are reminded, today especially, that we are meant to remain in Christ as Christ remains in us. We are also reminded that Jesus, the Incarnate God, is the vine upon which we grow, the branches that flow from the source of God's life.

Giving up our will to God's can be a painful endeavor. It is not easy to set our own desires and wants aside and allow God to step in and direct and guide our growth. But this is the only way to prevent deadly weeds from overtaking us and bringing us to a place of self-destruction. God's commandments are the very guideposts and benchmarks we need, yet many seek to remove them from all public view because they appear to limit self-expression and suppress what is considered by many to be "human freedom." They are the only way we can find freedom, however. And, until we learn this fundamental lesson, we will continue to spiral out of control, never really knowing who we are, what our potential can be or how life really can be lived. We will not know peace.

"Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." - Jn 15:4-5

# BRANCHING OUT ISN'T ALWAYS WHAT IT'S CRACKED UP TO BE

"That's a really beautiful tree branch. Man, would you look at the bark on that thing? The others are real duds, but that low-hanging branch has really got it all together."

I've never heard anyone say this. Maybe I just need to hang out with more arborists, but I can't recall ever hearing someone admire the particular beauty of a single branch. When someone comments on a tree, it's usually the whole tree — perhaps a visual element of it, like the color of the leaves or its height. But people don't usually zero in on one branch.

Maybe that's because usually, if one branch is looking a little weak, chances are every other branch is, too.

The Bible tells us that when we bear fruit as good everyday stewards, it is for the Father's

glory. We are the branch on His magnificent tree. What we have is from Him, and what we do likewise points back to Him. We also tend to reflect how well the other branches around us are incorporating the nutrients coming their way. That's all fine and good in theory. In practice, it can be an arduous exercise in humility.

When I do something virtuous or charitable or kind, there is a part of me that wants to stand out for it. I think that's true for all of us. We've given of ourselves in some way or overcome some human temptation to accomplish a little bit of good in this world, and even though we know God sees us, we'd really love for everyone else to see it, too.

It's a struggle, for sure. But we need to remember that our fruit belongs to the whole tree.

#### IS GOSSIP A MORTAL SIN?

To really ask this question, we must consider the Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness."


In its reflections on this commandment, The Catechism of the Catholic Church invites us to not only think about what bearing "false witness" means, but to also consider how we understand the truth and how we communicate more broadly. This is why so much of this section of the Catechism has to do with the gift of language. With this in mind, we will notice that the word "gossip" isn't used by the Catechism. Instead, we find the words "detraction" and "calumny," which are actually two forms that gossip can take, and both can be quite serious.

First, detraction is the of revealing "another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them," without morally valid reasons. Calumny, by extension, is saying something about another person that is untrue, and it is sinful because it "harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgements" (see no. 2477).

In all of our communication, we have to always recognize that we have a moral obligation to the

truth and to always work to protect the reputation and honor of our neighbors (see no. 2479).

Gossip can, in fact, prove to be a very serious sin. After all, the Catechism reminds us: "No one is bound to reveal the truth to someone who does not have the right to know it" (no. 2489). When we have gossiped, especially if we are aware we have damaged another person's good name or reputation, we want to make every effort to undo the damage we have done, including seeking the grace and forgiveness offered in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

# Deacon's Corner

In Sunday's Gospel, which was from Lk 24: 35-48, my homily focused on a some things that I feel will make a good DC. The Gospel refers to two very important and much used four word phrases that are used in the Bible more than any other four word phrases. They are PEACE BE WITH YOU and DO NOT BE AFRAID. These are important since we have heard them so often during this Octave of Easter. DO NOT BE AFRAID was first said by Jesus to Mary Magdalene when she visited His tomb and He was not there. When He appeared to Her, she thought Jesus was the gardener since Jesus blocked her from knowing who He was. When Jesus opened her eyes, she was startled and Jesus told her DO NOT BE AFRAID.

The next encounter with Jesus was on the Road to Emmaus which is about seven miles from Jerusalem. Two of His disciples were walking the road and Jesus appeared to them and walked with them without disclosing to them who He was. It was not until they asked Jesus to join them for dinner, when Jesus broke the bread, blessed it, and gave it to them, their eyes were opened and Jesus disappeared after they realized who it was.

This last time, as written in Sunday's Gospel, Jesus appeared to His disciples in the upper room and when He entered He said PEACE BE WITH YOU. The disciples were frightened, they thought Jesus was a ghost. Jesus spent some time to show them that He was flesh and bone, showed them the nail holes in His hands and feet. And Jesus also asked for food and ate with them. After they had eaten, Jesus called down the Holy Spirit in tongues of fire to dwell within His disciples so they would know that He would always be with them. They would never be alone.

And so it is true for all of us. As I said in my homily, Jesus was not just talking to the few disciples who were with Him in the upper room, Jesus was talking to all of us. You see, we are all disciples of Jesus Christ. We have all been infused

with the Holy Spirit who is with us 24/7. The question I would like you to consider is; "do you recognize the Holy Spirit who dwells within us?"

Jesus told His disciples that they are to be His witnesses and Jesus asks that of us also. I know, like His disciples, it is hard to be witness to something unless we have experienced it ourselves. So we must ask Jesus to open our hearts to His presence in our lives in order to "spread the Good News of Jesus Christ".

Remember, the disciples' lives were in turmoil. During the Crucifixion, the only disciple who was present was John. All the others were in hiding in fear for their lives after seeing what Jesus was put through. That is why Jesus had to come back to them and open their minds to understand that He had to suffer and die but then would rise from the dead. This is the truth of Easter and His Resurrection.

Pope Francis, in a homily on this Gospel, said; "we are afraid of JOY, and Jesus, by His Resurrection, gives us JOY, the JOY of being Christians, the JOY of following Him closely, the JOY of taking the road of the beatitudes, the JOY of being with Him". And Pope Francis described the fear of JOY as a Christian Illness.

So let's pray with Pope Francis, "that the Lord may open our minds and help us understand that He is a living reality, that He is with us always and accompanies us on our journey". Let us ask the Lord for the grace not to be afraid of JOY.

Jesus said; "whenever 2 or 3 are gathered in My name, I will be with you". The presence of Jesus brings peace and casts out fear. So let us all take some time and listen to Jesus when He says to us; DO NOT BE AFRAID and PEACE BE WITH YOU.



Sacrament of Baptism: Baptism is celebrated after parental participation in a preparation meeting. Please call the Parish Office for a date to attend. Do not finalize your plans until this formation meetina.

Sacrament of Confirmation: Preparation for Confirmation takes place during the high school years with the celebration of the Sacrament taking place no sooner than the end of sophomore year in high school. For more info and registration please contact the Youth Ministry Office at (847)726-4842.

**Sacrament of Reconciliation:** Saturdays from 4-4:45 before Saturday Vigil Mass.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: This Sacrament offers the Lord's healing strength and peace to anyone who is seriously or chronically ill, hospitalized, or about to undergo surgery. Please contact the Ministry Center (847)438-6622, if you wish to have someone anointed, or the Last Rites near death.

Sacrament of Marriage: Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance and no other plans should be finalized until the Parish Priest or Deacon has been consulted.
