

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

When we see God with true sincerity of heart and God passes us along our way, it is only then that we will be able to cry out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me!" We have to truly want to be healed by, and in union with, God in order for us to reach out to him. If God is only an abstract idea, theory, or someone found in the pages of a book, there is no motivation for a relationship and no desire to seek him. God needs to be real in order for faith to be real. It's all about the journey.

St. Augustine reminds us that "to fall in love with God is the greatest romance; to seek Him the greatest adventure: to find Him the greatest human achievement." We strive after many things and mercy is not always one of them. We think that we can find fulfillment and healing in other things only to discover that we are still short and empty. From the moment human beings were created, God has been calling us and seeking us. He has been walking right beside the human story from the minute He first breathed life into the first human soul. Are we able to recognize God as He walks with us? At some point we have to



realize that there is only one way to satisfy the deepest longings of the human heart and that is in relationship with our Creator. We are called to this. However, we make the huge error of thinking that what we are hearing is coming from somewhere else. We become confused. Every human being would certainly profit with wisdom if they realized Who calls them and to Whom they belong.

Then and only then will we realize that it is only our Divine Master who can give us true vision and heal us. Once we recognize and reach out for the merciful presence of our loving Maker, we will be able to see with our soul, understanding the true nature and depth of all things. God's mercy is always available. It doesn't matter how far we have strayed or how blind we become, God patiently waits to console us, guide us and heal us. All we need to do is desire Him. Once we reach out, we also realize that there is no greater love to be found than God's, no human adventure that comes even close to the thrill of a spiritual search. and no human achievement even remotely as satisfying as union with Him. This is where we belong. This is salvation.

Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way. - Mk 10:51-52

GIVING AS GOD DOES

Ask yourself this question — what would you pray for if you really believed God could and would do anything for you? In my experience, we all have something. We all have that miracle we're afraid to request, afraid we will be disappointed.

Do we doubt God's readiness to give because we ourselves have such an imperfect understanding of charity and love? Maybe if we had better faith in God we would be more ready to give of ourselves — and maybe if we were more ready to give of ourselves, we would understand more clearly the ways of God.

Because we're not really afraid that God can't do something. We know He can do anything. What we're afraid of is that He will do what He always does: give us what we need, not what we want.

Have you ever had a friend in need and you just wanted to give them something — a meal, a phone call, a text? Not because you knew it would help, but simply because you wanted to reach out. And have they ever said to you: It wasn't so much what you gave, but the fact that you did. You gave them what they needed even if it wasn't what they specifically asked for.


When we give in this manner, we are giving as God does. Sometimes we are afraid to ask because we don't want to be disappointed. But remember, the blind man on the road got what he asked for, but he would have gotten what he needed even if his answer had been the opposite. God's generosity is always reckless, and it's always perfect.

I HAVE A FRIEND WHO RECEIVES COMMUNION, BUT WHO I KNOW FOR A FACT IS IN A STATE OF MORTAL SIN. SHOULD I TELL OUR PRIEST? IS IT MY RESPONSIBILITY TO SAY SOMETHING?

While we may always want to do what is best for our friends and family members, we have a responsibility to respect their privacy and their conscience. In its reflections on the Eighth Commandment ("You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor"), the Catechism of the Catholic Church states,

"Respect for the reputation of persons forbids every attitude and word likely to cause them unjust injury. [One] becomes guilt: -of rash judgment who, even tacitly, assumes as true, without sufficient foundation, the moral fault of a neighbor; -of



We will never truly know what is in a person's mind, heart, and soul; only God knows those things. We

should, of course, take our concerns to God and entrust the person about whom we are concerned to God's grace and mercy. If we have concerns about the spiritual wellbeing of someone with whom we are close, we should go to the person themselves and talk about our fears and concerns. Unless it is a case of abuse or

endangerment (which we have a moral and even legal responsibility to report to the appropriate authorities), we ultimately do not have the freedom to share another's persons faults or sins, however good we think our intentions might be.


Who benefits from blood donation?

Every unit of blood is collected from volunteer donors who meet specific criteria and have been screened according to strict guidelines. Every unit (pint) is collected, transported, tested and stored according to tightly-controlled procedures.

Examples of transfusion needs are:

- Cancer: up to 8 units/month
- Bone Marrow Transplant: up to 2 units/day
- Liver Transplant: up to 100 units
- Auto Accident: up to 50 units
- Cardiovascular Surgery: 2-25 unit





suggest you read it to better understand what I am putting forward in the DC. Verse 9 in this Gospel seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened for you". I know you might be thinking; "Deacon John, I know that verse and have heard it all my life", but I am looking at it from a different perspective than you might think.

You see, while this is God's promise to us, I wanted to better understand what we should expect from this as our life goes on. In thinking about this verse as I was younger, I thought that all we had to do is "ask" God for something and He would give it to us. As I have grown older (and wiser, I think), I have realized there is more to God's love for us than just giving us things. So the question comes in "what do we expect from God?" And more important; "how do we expect to get it?"

My first instinct to answer the questions above is that we pray and when we do we create expectations within ourselves. Do we pray so that God will give us all we want? And what is it we really want? Do we want fame, fortune, victory, healing, love, success, etc.? Perhaps we want all of these things plus more as life goes on. But is this the answer of God's plan for us? Does this build the Kingdom of God for our eternal salvation? I hope you came to the same conclusion I have come to and that our relationship with God, Our Father, and our connection to Him through prayer, is much richer and more fulfilling than asking Him to grant us our checklist of desires.

But before I go any further with this, I want to share a story of my youth that led me to understand the meaning of the verse 9 I decided to write about. As a young man, I prayed a lot, we attended Mass every day during both grade school and high

oday's topic is based on a homily I gave this school. When I was in the eighth grade and thirteen past Thursday on the Gospel of Lk 11: 5-13. I years old, the gas station where my parents bought gas was owned by a fellow named Moses Joseph and he also owned a motorcycle shop. He decided reads; "And I tell you, ask and you will receive, to renovate his gas station and raffle a Prima Motorscooter giving a ticket to each customer who bought gas. Over time, he had given me dozens of tickets and he knew how much I wanted to win the Prima. My brother, Bob, had asked me if he could have some tickets so I gave him three. I prayed and prayed to win. So much so that my mom, along with my grandma and Aunt Margaret, did a field trip to Carey, Ohio (we lived in Detroit at the time), which was the shrine of Our Lady of Consolation. While there, I prayed even more asking God to let me win the Prima. When the evening of the drawing was to take place, my mom drove me to the gas station. We sat in the car and watched Mr. Joseph reach into the bucket of tickets. The first ticket he pulled out, he read it and threw it over his shoulder and he did with the next two tickets. The fourth ticket he pulled out, he looked and waved to me and mom to come in. Low and behold, I thought did God answer my prayers? When we got inside, he showed us the ticket and it had Bob's name on it. Remember, Bob had only three tickets and I had dozens. So yes, the Prima came home but not the way I had expected. Since Bob and I were both too young to drive it, we sold it for \$750.00 and Bob was kind enough to split the money with me. That \$375.00 was the first investment I ever made in the stock market.
