

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

What are the little ones? They are the poor, the marginalized, the women and men at the well, the Zacchaeus' looking for Jesus from a tree, those mired in sin. the blind who want to see, and the lame who want to walk. They are the lepers and the different ones who have been told that they are unclean, and the ones who suffer from abuse and grave injustices and oppression. They are children who want nothing more than to be loved and enjoy celebrating their innocence. These are all the little ones and they are all vulnerable. Life already brings them burdens, we don't need to add to them.

St. Oscar Romero said, "When the church hears the cry of the oppressed it cannot but denounce the social structures that give rise to and perpetuate the misery from which the cry arises." Why are so many people still so gravely hurting? We have the resources and the means to make things better. We choose not to. There are still those things called greed, pride, lust, apathy, jealously, gluttony, and anger that prevent us from seeing each other and people to



be loved and not objects to be used. Is this how God intended things to be?

God loves what is good and upright. It doesn't matter who did it or where it came from. In God's eyes, the end result is always faith, hope, and love. Those will always unite a person with God. We fill our lives with many things that are not good either for ourselves or for others. All of us have to work to discover what it is, exactly, that leads to the world's brokenness. There are people, systems, and ideologies in place that foster

oppression and injustice rather than equity and fairness. Sadly, our complacency can be the greatest evil. Turning a blind eye, ignoring the truth, and believing that we are helpless to fix so great a problem, does little to move us closer to the kingdom of God. As members of the Body of Christ, we cannot condone anything that keeps people in misery.

As it is said, charity begins at home. Perhaps a good place to start is with our own households and making sure their foundations are properly laid.

At that time, John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied, "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me." - Mk 9:38-39

BREAKING THE STEWARDSHIP MOLD

Have you noticed how we always tend to pigeonhole one another — and ourselves? "I could never serve on the Parish Council. That's for Rick and Ellen and that whole group of people who have done it for years." "Greg takes care of faith formation in the parish — he always has. He doesn't need my help." "I can't afford to give the big bucks like those families who sit up front can. My offering wouldn't matter even if I did increase it."

Thinking like this is a good indication that we aren't in conversation with God about what His will is for our lives. If we have already decided what we are and are not meant to do, we aren't likely to pray over it, to discern it.

We have to be open to the spirit of the Lord wherever it leads us, regardless of what we or others have come to expect from us. We human beings come to believe that we are such good judges of what others can offer — or what we ourselves can offer. But God has plans for us to which we aren't privy. God calls everyone to serve Him in the way that pleases Him best, and only He can decide what that is. Everyday Stewardship demands a continual accounting of who we can be, what we can offer — even if it's outside our comfort zone, even if it's something that never occurred to us before.

There's only one Person who can tell us what God wants from us. Do we even think to ask Him?



WHAT DO CATHOLICS BELIEVE ABOUT THE RESURRECTION OF THE DEAD?

Every Sunday, we proclaim in the Creed that we believe "in the resurrection of the body." Does that mean Christ's resurrection or our own? Both! Jesus' resurrection is part of the work of salvation, but it's also a sign of what's to come. While death separates our bodies and our souls, this was not the intention of God when He first created us. It's an effect of original sin. At the end of time, our bodies and our souls will be reunited.

Scientifically, we may have questions about this, since bodies decompose over the course of centuries. Or what about the saints, whose relics are spread around the earth? How the resurrection will happen is a mystery. But we know that our resurrected body will be our body. If we are in heaven, our body will be in a glorified state. Some theologians speculate what this glorification will be like based on Jesus' resurrected body. Will we be able to walk through walls? Will we eat, since Jesus

broke bread with his disciples? We don't really know the answers to these questions. We do know, however, that we will be free from the effects of the fall (such as sickness and pain) and physical defects that occurred in life. Christ redeems us as whole persons, body and soul!

Dear St. Francis de Sales Parish,

By now, the archdiocese will have informed you that my return to the parish will be delayed while its Independent Review Board investigates new information about an accusation against me that had been previously closed. I hope this will be expeditiously resolved. I write to you with both sadness and disappointment that I will not be returning as we had planned and with the firm belief that this additional investigation will result in my exoneration. I would like the parish to know that there is not a new accuser.

It is important that you know I categorically deny that I have ever abused a child. I have faith the investigation will confirm what I know to be true and that I will return to parish ministry when it concludes. At the same time, I want to affirm that the Church must be vigilant in protecting children and that only by investigating all such charges can we fulfill that obligation.

I am grateful to Father Jerome Jacob, Father Robert Heinz, the visiting priests, our Deacons, the parish and school staff and many volunteers in our ministries for their work during this difficult time. I pray for them and you and ask that you keep me in your prayers as we endure this separation. I am humbled by the on-going prayers and support of the good people in our good parish. Please be patient and stay together as a parish family, dedicated to the teachings of Jesus and each other.

Dear Parishioners of St. Francis de Sales Parish,

Last week, I informed you that our Independent Review Board (IRB) had found there was insufficient reason to suspect Father David Ryan had committed sexual abuse of a minor and that I was reinstating him as your pastor, effective immediately.

However, since then, additional information, not previously provided to the Archdiocese or the IRB, has surfaced and that will mean delaying Father Ryan's return to the parish while it is thoroughly investigated. Father Ryan has assured us that he will cooperate fully as he understands that we must take every allegation seriously in accordance with our child protection policies.

I share your disappointment at this news, especially as I know plans were being made to welcome Father Ryan back this weekend. But, I ask your patience once again as we fulfill our obligation to keep the children entrusted to us safe and proceed in a way that serves the cause of justice for all concerned. Please continue to pray for everyone involved in this matter and know that I am praying for you. We will share new information as it becomes available.

of the Holy Cross. The Gospel is Jn 3: 13-17 and I You might want to read the Gospel before reading the DC to give you a better idea of what I am writing.

The focus of this Feast Day is based on the phrase; "We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You, for by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world".

Let's begin with a little history lesson. The Persians invented crucifixion and it was perfected by the Romans. Crucifixion was considered to be the cruelest form of execution in the ancient world. It was designed to be a deterrent, the victim was subjected to great physical pain and distress and then left to die over a period of days. To the Jewish people, it was the most accursed of all forms of death, and a sign that the victim had lost all hope and connection with God.

Today's Feast marks the finding of the true Cross by the Empress Helena in 325 AD and the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem some ten years later. But this feast is more than just the marking of historical events. As we celebrate the Exaltation of the Cross, we are invited to take a moment to reflect on the great mystery of our redemption in Christ, and by doing so to understand that what was once a symbol of death and rejection, has become for all Christians a powerful symbol of God's abundant love and His offer of life for us all. You see, there can be no life without death and no resurrection without the Cross.

It is early this Tuesday morning and I was preparing If you take the time to read all of the Gospel accounts my homily for the Communion Service that I of the Crucifixion, we can see that each evangelist perform each Tuesday and Thursday morning. With takes a different approach in the description and today we are celebrating the Feast of the Exaltation detail of Christ's death. While never denying the horrors of this form of execution, John presents the thought it might be a good subject for today's DC. Crucified Jesus, not in lonely helplessness, but in majestic control.

> For John, the Cross is not a defeat but a triumph. Think about it, the forces of sin and death throw all they have at the Lord of Life, and yet to no avail. Jesus' obedience and self-emptying do not end in the silence of His death, but in glorious exaltation and salvation for all who believe in Him.

> That is the core of this Feast Day. Jesus does indeed hang on the Cross in agony and pain, but as the Gospel says; "He is equally raised up as a King on a mighty throne". He is lifted up so all who gaze upon Him, all who take refuge in His victory, all who believe in Him might also experience healing and a share in His eternal life that is offered to us all.

> Today as we look upon the Cross, let us not see it as a means of death, but a holy expression of God's love for us. Let us cherish that love, live in that love and, most importantly, share that love. We should never be embarrassed to witness our belief and love of God both in words and in our actions. Remember, by His wounds we are healed and by His Cross we are offered eternal salvation.
