THE LIFE CYCLE OF THE SEED

Here in the middle of summer, many people grow vegetable and flower gardens, or appreciate the work of others by buying produce from roadside stands and farmer's markets. All our readings today embrace one of God's smallest but most common miracles as a metaphor: the seed and its cycle, and all that it stands for. Isaiah reminds us that just as God waters the earth and cares for it so that seeds may grow, so the Word of God will come and not return to God until it has borne fruit. Psalm 65 describes the cycle of growth and personifies fields that "shout for joy." Romans has "creation groaning in labor pains" as it waits for its seed to come to fruition, redemption of the body. Similarly, Jesus teaches the crowds by using the parable of the sower and the seed.

Soil Conditions

I am a hopeless gardener. I never met a plant I couldn't swiftly kill with good intentions and poor understanding of soil conditions.

Because really, it's all about the soil conditions—at least, that's what Google tells me when I helplessly search phrases like "Why aren't any of my seeds sprouting? Please, I tried so hard." I can never seem to match the right type of soil offering the right type of drainage and texture with the right plant. I can't understand why it's not enough to bury the seed in whatever ground is available, sprinkle some water and ask it, very nicely, to grow.

This is also a quality that makes me a poor evangelist to people who do not share my beliefs. How many times have I encountered a friend or loved one who left the faith, and I tried to coax them back by hurling Catechism passages in their direction, offering advice they never asked for and are ill-equipped to understand? I sow these seeds of witness and bang my fists in frustration that they rot where I plant them, never realizing that it's all about the soil

It is Christ, and Christ alone, who works within the heart. It is Christ who is the sower of the seed, not me. When I leave him out of the equation, when I fail to offer the Person and instead only offer the teaching, I can anticipate that any witness I have to offer will rot where it is planted just as sure as a tulip bulb in a bed of clay.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do we use incense at Mass?

Answer:

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).


Gospel Reading

Who benefits from blood donation?

At Versiti Blood Center of Illinois, formerly Heartland Blood Centers, we never forget the patients who receive the blood we collect. Every unit of blood is collected from volunteer donors who meet specific criteria and have been screened according to strict guidelines. Every unit (pint) is collected, transported, tested and stored according to tightlycontrolled procedures.

Examples of transfusion needs are:

- Cancer: up to 8 units/month
- Bone Marrow Transplant: up to 2 units/day
- Liver Transplant: up to 100 units
- Auto Accident: up to 50 units
- Cardiovascular Surgery: 2-25 unit

THEOLOGY 101

Engaging in the world with gratitude, a little wariness and hope

We live in the world and deal with it daily. It can cause us both joy and sorrow. The natural world, with its beauty, can engender a sense of wonder and even awe, although it can also unleash terrible destructive forces that we know all too well, such as hurricanes, earthquakes and floods. The human world is an even more dramatic mix of good and bad. We know exemplary people of wisdom and compassion, but we also know the stridency and violence of living in a polarized society.

As people of faith, what are we to make of this? Even when we turn to the word of God, a direct answer seems to elude us. For example, in the first letter of John, we hear: "Do not love the world or things of the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him." (2:15) But then, in sharp contrast, we hear the words of Jesus to Nicodemus in John's Gospel: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (3:16) The Bible appears to be ambiguous on this question of how we are to understand and deal with our world. In fact, there is a way to understand this important question, but first, we need some

Across history, religiously minded people — no matter what their religious tradition— often have viewed the world in terms of extremes. For example, some may see the world as completely tainted by sin or totally corrupted by it. And their response is to separate themselves as much as possible from the world. On the other side, there are those who are naively optimistic about how good everything is in and about the world. And their response is to live and let live and enjoy what they can.

The Catholic faith and spiritual tradition, in its most authentic expression, has its take on the world and how we are to live and navigate the world. Catholic faith has a complex sense of the world and of life itself. First, our faith proclaims the goodness of the world. That is already evident at the beginning of creation. Chapter One of Genesis says at various points in the creation narrative, "God saw how good it was." (1:10) Then, our faith also affirms that from our earliest moments (Gn 3), creation and our lives have been marked by sin, a falling away from God's original plan. It becomes a deeply personal matter. St. Paul says that we find ourselves divided within ourselves (Rom 7) and split off from our true selves. Finally, the last word, as St. Paul describes it, is our redemption in Christ: "Whoever is in Christ is a new creation ..." (2 Cor 5:17)

In short, Catholic Christians have a complex sense of themselves and their world. They see the world and themselves as fundamentally good, created by God, and yet marked by sin. In the end, the last word is redemption in Christ. But what does this mean practically?

Catholics approach the world, themselves and every element of

creation with gratitude because it is good. At the same time, they have a prudent wariness, because it is marked by sin. Finally, they approach the world with hope because it is redeemed in Christ. Unlike people who have a uniformly negative assessment of the world as a place of evil and corruption, a reality to be avoided, Catholics engage in the world and its enterprises. Unlike people with a naively positive view of everything Catholics move cautiously and knowingly through life. Finally, their hope of redemption in Christ leads them to work for the transformation of the world into the reality that God has in mind. They will engage the world and be its salt, light and leaven.
