



#### **NEVER LOSE HOPE**

God's word speaks to our hearts today, acknowledging the sad fact that we lose hope at times, and encouraging us to trust in the Lord. Isaiah speaks of God's astonishing plan to use Cyrus, a Persian king, to deliver God's people from exile. After generations in captivity, the Israelites take new hope in this unexpected plan and praise God's might. Saint Paul's letter to the Thessalonians encourages Christ's followers there to remain faithful to their call. Never tiring, they continue their "labor of love and endurance in hope." The Gospel relates a heartbreaking reality in Christ's ministry: plots to humiliate and capture Jesus. Knowing their treacherous plans, Jesus does not despair. He remains faithful to God and persists in his own labor of love.

#### The Tax of Caesar

Too often, I confuse this world with the next.

Every day has its set of problems that need dealing with. Some are very easily discernible as problems of this world: I am tired, and I need a nap and a latte. Some are very obviously problems of eternity: I need to ask for forgiveness, but I'm not ready to admit it.

Most problems are a subtle, maddening mix of the two: my body feels tired, obscuring how tired my soul also feels, while making me very cranky, which is keeping me from asking for the forgiveness I need.

It's not that the nap and the latte *aren't* solutions. Heaven forfend! I would never propose such a thing. Sleep and coffee, I am confident, can fix almost any problem in this world. *This* world.

Too often, I slap a one-size-fits-all earthly band-aid on all my problems and rush on to the next thing. But if the problem is an issue of my soul, I may as well pay for a parking ticket in Monopoly money.

I render unto Caesar, and I forget about what is owed to God. I apply solutions meant for the here and now to problems that have eternal consequences. The spiritual problems are dismissed, shoved to the back of my mind. For when I have time, I tell myself. For when I am ready.

But the only time we have is now. God is no king of this earth, and he does not ask for a tax offering. He asks for our heart. He doesn't want us for minions but for children.

## Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

#### Question:

What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground?

#### Answer:

This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask is: How should the minsters respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).



## **Engaging in the world** with gratitude, a little wariness and hope

We live in the world and deal with it daily. It can cause us both joy and sorrow. The natural world, with its beauty, can engender a sense of wonder and even awe, although it can also unleash terrible destructive forces that we know all too well, such as hurricanes, earthquakes and floods. The human world is an even more dramatic mix of good and bad. We know exemplary people of wisdom and compassion, but we also know the stridency and violence of living in a polarized society.


As people of faith, what are we to make of this? Even when we turn to the word of God, a direct answer seems to elude us. For example, in the first letter of John, we hear: "Do not love the world or things of the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him." (2:15) But then, in sharp contrast, we hear the words of Jesus to Nicodemus in John's Gospel: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (3:16) The Bible appears to be ambiguous on this question of how we are to understand and deal with our world. In fact, there is a way to understand this important question, but first, we need some context.

Across history, religiously minded people - no matter what their religious tradition-often have viewed the world in terms of extremes. For example, some may see the world as completely tainted by sin or totally corrupted by it. And their response is to separate themselves as much as possible from the world. On the other side, there are those who are naively optimistic about how good everything is in and about the world. And their response is to live and let live and enjoy what they can.

The Catholic faith and spiritual tradition, in its most authentic expression, has its take on the world and how we are to live and navigate the world. Catholic faith has a complex sense of the world and of life itself. First, our faith proclaims the goodness of the world. That is already evident at the beginning of creation. Chapter One of Genesis says at various points in the creation narrative, "God saw how good it was." (1:10) Then, our faith also affirms that from our earliest moments (Gn 3), creation and our lives have been marked by sin, a falling away from God's original plan. It becomes a deeply personal matter. St. Paul says that we find ourselves divided within ourselves (Rom7) and split off from our true selves. Finally, the last word, as St. Paul describes it, is our redemption in Christ: "Whoever is in Christ is a new creation ..." (2 Cor 5:17)

In short, Catholic Christians have a complex sense of themselves and their world. They see the world and themselves as fundamentally good, created by God, and yet marked by sin. In the end, the last word is redemption in Christ. But what does this mean practically?

Catholics approach the world, themselves and every element of

creation with gratitude because it is good. At the same time, they have a prudent wariness, because it is marked by sin. Finally, they approach the world with hope because it is redeemed in Christ, Unlike people who have a uniformly negative assessment of the world as a place of evil and corruption, a reality to be avoided, Catholics engage in the world and its enterprises. Unlike people with a naively positive view of everything Catholics move cautiously and knowingly through life. Finally, their hope of redemption in Christ leads them to work for the transformation of the world into the reality that God has in mind. They will engage the world and be its salt, light and leaven.
