

POPE FRANCIS – BELOVED AND CONTROVERSIAL

On Dec. 13, Pope Francis will celebrate the 50th anniversary of his priestly ordination. Across those years, as priest, bishop and now pope, he has dedicated himself tirelessly to the renewal begun by the Second Vatican Council.

Paradoxically, Pope Francis is both immensely popular throughout the world and, at the same time, intensely controversial in certain limited but vocal quarters of the Church. How can we understand this? And, what does it mean?

Perhaps the best starting point is to identify the pope's mission and ministry in the Church. The pope is the successor of St. Peter. The Lord Jesus entrusted to Peter three responsibilities that constitute the "Petrine" ministry in the Church, which his successors are to fulfill:

- To be the rock of fidelity for believers assuring them of the truth of the Gospel;
- To foster and maintain the unity of the Church; and,
- To encourage believers by confirming his brothers and sisters in faith.

This is the threefold mission that the pope exercises in and for the Church of God: fidelity, unity and confirming encouragement.

Every pope has carried these responsibilities throughout history. The Holy Spirit leads the Church and guides whoever is the Holy Father, but human limitations and historical circumstances also shape how those responsibilities are fulfilled. Pope Francis has clearly followed this Petrine ministry, but in a particular way. For example, he has steadfastly affirmed the truths of faith. At the same time, he is not satisfied just to enunciate those truths. He wants to find ways to bring people along so that they can embrace them with their lives. Sometimes, as his predecessor Pope St. John Paul II indicated, this involves a "law of gradualism." So often, we cannot snap into the ideal all at once. We need help, and we need to be brought along on our unfolding life journeys. Some commentators have said this approach dilutes the truth. I think that it actually reflects a deeper respect



for the truth of faith that is meant to be lived and embodied and not just professed.

When Pope Francis fosters the unity of the Church, he insures that the Church is like a "loving mother" welcoming all her children, especially those on the margins who may have been excluded, for example, the poor, the distressed and even the sinful. Some people view this dimly as giving an "easy pass" to those who don't deserve it. I think, on the contrary, that Pope Francis sees this expansive welcome as a manifestation of the mercy of God that brings us all together in God's own family.

At the Last Supper in Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells Peter to confirm his brothers and sisters, that is, to encourage them. Pope Francis takes up this task in his own remarkable way. He encourages the Church by nudging all of us to go in new directions to which the Lord is summoning us in our time. Take the initiative, he says to all believers, to share the Gospel in your words, your lives and in your work. Be missionary disciples. Some take this as dangerous innovation. It seems to me to be a retrieval of what Cardinal Martini called "the freshness of the Gospel."

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, is indeed much beloved, probably because he projects so much warmth and love for everyone. Even more importantly, he has fulfilled his pledge to carry on Peter's ministry captured in the words: fidelity, unity, encouragement. For that, we need to thank God and pray for Pope Francis' strength to persevere.

Parish Pastoral Council Meeting

Minutes of December 3, 2019 Meeting Ministry Center - Fr. Joseph Firnbach Meeting Room

Ryan (had to leave early due to receiving a call from a parishioner to come to Good Shepherd Hospital), Marty Bush, John Ergastolo, Melissa Larson, Julie Morones, Christina Sikorski, Pam Lynch, Tom Purtell, Doug Samz, and Kyle Schmitt **Not Present:** Laura Angelini (excused), Mimi McGlauchlin (excused), Judy Reilly (excused), Deacon John Sfire (excused)

Fr. Ryan had to leave the meeting for an emergency so he asked Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council Tom Purtell to preside at the meeting. Chair Purtell began the meeting at 6 pm with the Renew My Church prayer.

1. FIX IT CAMPAIGN – Doug Samz, Finance Council Chair

- a. Operational Update PPC postponed an update from Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire because they were not able to attend the meeting, due to an emergency.
- b. Financial Update Doug Samz

Doug Samz indicated that the parish is in good shape for total contributions although the target of \$1.7 million has yet to be achieved. Approximately \$1,482,000 has been collected as of this date with \$13,000 outstanding. Doug Samz and Pam Lynch are not concerned about collectability. Pam Lynch indicated that a new mailing went out to prospective new donors that have not donated in the past. Another 20 or so donors pledged and paid. Doug Samz reconciles contributions with Pam Lynch on a quarterly basis. Through September 30, 2019, there was \$130,000 available in the bank. It was discussed what projects are remaining to complete, which is the flooring in the church and the area around the Altar. Christina Sikorski, PTO Chair, brought up the suggestion of adding railings on either side of the altar.

2. PARISH SCHOOL UPDATE - Kyle Schmitt, Principal

Kyle Schmitt distributed a sheet showing Enrollment Projections which is Attachment A. The points highlighted were as follows:

- a. Based on previous trends from previous years, the Preschool program is expected to be at full capacity again for the 2020-2021 school year with at least three classrooms and possibly a fourth class depending on interest shown in the summer of 2020.
- b. Two grades have a projected net re-enrollment rate of less than 100% which are the 4 year old preschool class and the fifth grade class.
 - i. The 4 yr. old preschool class includes PreK, and the net re-enrollment rate is projected to be about 54%. The reason for this is many parents send their child(ren) to SFDS because it is a great value for preschool in the area with high quality staff, but then they send their children to the free public schools for K-8 so enrollment drops off.
 - ii. From fifth to sixth grade, the school loses approximately 10% of students that transition to the public junior high again for cost saving reasons.
- c. Kyle Schmitt then reviewed the other school updates noted on his handout.
 - i. The theme for the 2019-2020 is the "Best Year Ever". Christy Sikorski said they are trying to engage parents more and be more inclusive and collaborative.
 - ii. Kyle Schmitt discussed the school initiatives for the current school year were set last March and are the following:
 - 1. Focusing on improving the K-8 writing and MS Math curriculums
 - 2. STREAMS development Stands for "Science, Technology, English, Arts, Math, and Social Studies. They already had the kick-off for expanding these programs.
 - 3. The School Board Workstreams are ideas that came out of the Bright Minds Survey and feedback has been or is still being obtained. Kyle highlighted the following areas:
 - a. Communication The new website is being redesigned.
 - b. Marketing and Enrollment -There is new branding being implemented (i.e. new logo on uniforms)
 - c. Fundraising This is an ongoing project.






