



EMMAUS AND THE MASS

Emmaus might as well be Brigadoon. We hear of it in this one story and it's only in Luke—and then it disappears. The journey to Emmaus is one of the most beloved stories about Jesus, and yet the town is probably "mythical" in the truest sense. Like so much of life, this story is about the journey, not the destination. Running away from Jerusalem and their fears, probably going home in disillusionment, two of Jesus' disciples encounter a stranger on the road who, like a rabbi, is able to help them understand their experiences using his deep knowledge of scripture. Later, sharing a meal with him, they recognize the stranger as Jesus, and they return to Jerusalem to tell the others. How like our Mass—we hear the scriptures and an explanation of them, we share a meal, and then we go out to tell the good news. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

"I Am Not Afraid — I Was Born to Do This."

Have you ever felt like you weren't doing the work you should be doing?

We have all had jobs that leave us feeling unfulfilled. Bored. Dreading the next day. We may even experience a sensation of unfamiliarity, of being unable to recognize ourselves.

Most of us have also been lucky enough to have a job that we love — a vocation, a calling that makes us look in the mirror and think, This. This is who I'm supposed to be. I recognize this person.

For me, that work is the work of marriage and motherhood. The hours are terrible, the pay is even worse, and my coworkers are frequently disappointed in me — but it doesn't matter. When I look in the mirror every morning and see my tired, wrinkled face gazing back, choruses of "I said I don't want the BLUE SHIRT, MOMMY, ugh!" and "Honey, I've got an early meeting, I'm so sorry but I have to run," ringing in the background, I think to myself: I recognize this girl. She was born to do this.

Christ's own disciples did not recognize him on the road to Emmaus. It wasn't until he took the bread and broke it that their eyes were opened, and they realized they had known it all along — "Were not our hearts burning within us?"

In that moment, Christ was doing the very work he was born to do, making the sacrifice.

I don't know what kind of vocation you are called to. I don't know what kind of work reveals your true self. But I hope that whatever work you are doing, you can look in the mirror and feel your heart burning within you.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

What are the requirements for being a confirmation sponsor?

Answer:

Although many dioceses have specific requirements for who can be a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Code of Canon Law identifies certain requirements that are true for all dioceses and parishes. First, the sponsor should be chosen by the one to be confirmed (or, in some cases, by the parents or even the pastor). Second, a sponsor must be at least sixteen years old (unless the local bishop has chosen another age, or a special exception has been made). Third, the sponsor must be a Catholic who has been confirmed and who has already received the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Beyond this, they must lead "a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on." Fourth, they can have no sort of canonical penalty or impediment. Finally, they cannot be either the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (See Canons 893, §1 and 874, §1).

In some cultures, it is customary for one of the confirmand's godparents to act as sponsor, although this is not required by Church law.

To learn about the requirements for your parish or diocese, you can consult your pastor or your parish or diocesan director of religious education or the diocese's office liturgy and worship.

Peter encourages his community to "conduct yourselves with reverence during the time of your sojourning" (life on earth). How might you show respect to others this week?


Gospel Reading

A Eucharistic Revival that Renews the Church: Part II By Cardinal Blase Cupich

As I noted in Part I of this series, with his letter on liturgical formation, "Desiderio Desideravi," Pope Francis has made a unique contribution to the three-year eucharistic revival launched by the U.S. Catholic bishops.

By showing the link between the Church remaining faithful to the mission of Christ and the celebration of the liturgy, the Holy Father is inviting "the whole Church to rediscover, to safeguard, and to live the truth and power of the Christian celebration, (lest) the beauty of the Christian celebration and its necessary consequences for the life of the Church ... be spoiled by a superficial and foreshortened understanding of its value or, worse yet, by its being exploited in service of some ideological vision, no matter what the hue."



This Concern Is Not New

His concern about a superficial understanding of the liturgy that disconnects our worship from the Church's mission is not new. Pope Pius XII warned that the liturgy cannot be understood merely as "decorative ceremonies or a mere sum total of laws and precepts that govern the cult" ("Mediator Dei"). So, too, the bishops who gathered for the Second Vatican Council 60 years ago made it clear that the aim of the liturgical reforms was not about cosmetically modernizing our worship. Rather, like all of Vatican II's reforms, the goals were

"to impart an ever-increasing vigor to the Christian life of the faithful; to adapt more suitably to the needs of our own times those institutions which are subject to change; to foster whatever can promote union among all who believe in Christ; to strengthen whatever can help to call the whole of mankind into the household of the Church" ("Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy").

The starting point for the renewal envisioned by the Council was the promotion of the full, active and conscious participation of all the baptized in the full breadth of church life, including the liturgy. Engaging all the members would be needed if the Church was going to respond to the precise challenges facing believers and all of humanity.

Historical Context

Consider the historical context of the decision by Pope St. John XXIII to call a council, and the contemporary challenges facing the Church. By the time Angelo Roncalli was elected pope in 1958, humanity in the 20th century was deeply divided, having suffered through a global pandemic and economic depression.

Similarly, Christians, particularly in Europe, expressed doubts about the significance of their faith following two world wars fought for the most part by "Christian nations." People wondered whether faith and religion really mattered, since the Gospel of Christ, the Prince of Peace, preached and celebrated among these people for nearly 2,000 years, seemed to have little impact on these "Christian nations." Likewise, many of the faithful expressed the concern that the only time the Church seemed to engage the world was to offer criticism or condemnation.

A "Light to All Nations"

For the Church to be a credible "light to the nations," all her members need to embrace their responsibility for building solidarity within the human family and reaching out to it with love and concern. The bishops at the Council expressed this new vision of the role of each of the baptized and the Church as they addressed the modern world: "The joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties of the men of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ. Indeed, nothing genuinely human fails to raise an echo in their hearts. For theirs is a community composed of men. United in Christ, they are led by the Holy Spirit in their journey to the Kingdom of their Father and they have welcomed the news of salvation which is meant for every man. That is why this community realizes that it is truly linked with mankind and its history by the deepest of bonds" ("Gaudium et Spes").
