In today's apostolic letter, however, Peter gives us the "cornerstone" of our vocation, the description of what each of us is called to first and foremost by our baptism. He describes our vocation as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of [God's] own, so that you may announce the praises" of Christ, who called us out of darkness into light (1 Peter 2:9). All of us, no matter what path our life's vocation may take us down, have been chosen by God, made holy, and anointed as priests in the high priesthood of Christ through baptism. 

Deacon's Corner

t is Sunday afternoon and I thought I'd get a jump on this week's DC. For the past five weeks, I have been on the altar M-F at noon and Sunday at 9:30 live-streaming Mass with Fr. Ryan. Today's gospel was the Road to Emmaus (Lk 24:13-35) as it was on Easter Sunday and Wednesday, the 15th within the Octave of Easter. I did the homily at all three of those Masses and felt it would be a good topic for this week's DC.

Doing the homily on the same gospel three times in two weeks posed a bit of a challenge since I didn't want to be repetitive in my presentation, so I did a little extra research on the subject. I found that archaeologists were never able to identify the location of Emmaus or the road thereto. I realized that was because Emmaus is everywhere. Emmaus is found in every Church when Christ's Word in scripture and the Eucharist are given to us, just as He did with Cleopas and the second disciple. This is how Jesus Christ identifies Himself to us.

Looking back 2,000 years, His disciples had hoped, believed, followed Jesus....but now He is dead. So many left everything to follow Jesus and they now felt that their lives, their future, their dreams have been shattered. During this time, all of Jesus' disciples were still in hiding for their own lives, at least that's what they thought they should be doing. It took Jesus numerous times to visit them after His Resurrection to assure them of "who He is". As I said in one of my homilies, I believe the disciples were expecting the Messiah to come as a warrior to overthrow the Roman Empire. They were not expecting the Messiah to come as their savior, with the full intention of "forgiving their sins".

Take a moment and think about what I call the "D" words; disappointment, doubt, defeat, discouragement, depression, despair and even death. You see, I believe that we can all identify with the feelings of these two disciples in some, if not many, ways. And that is OK. You see, Jesus reveals Himself to all of us every time in His Word

and the Sacrament of the Eucharist. When we receive Jesus in this way, in order for Him not to vanish as He did with His disciples, we must keep our eyes of faith on Him and Him alone. The message was simple. The Word of God sets our hearts on fire and the Eucharist opens our eyes, renews us, heal us and recreates us. And that is what is available to all of us as it was to the two disciples on the road to Emmaus.

We all have our own road to Emmaus. Yes, we have and/ or will have doubts, disappointment, etc. over something that has or will happen in our lives. The question we always should ask ourselves is "how do we overcome those feelings?" My suggestion is to pick up our bible, read scripture and attend Mass to receive the Eucharist. Jesus Christ never leaves us, He is always with us. It is our own human emotions that create the barrier between ourselves and the Risen Lord.


Ask yourself the question, "how many times does Jesus Christ come to us and we don't recognize Him?"

I promise you there have been many times for all of us. You see, Jesus is in the face of our children, our spouse, our friends, and even strangers we don't even know. But if we see Jesus in all who are before us, then you know what I mean. I want to leave you with this question; "how many times have we missed Jesus in our own lives?" Give that question some thought!

Tomorrow, Wednesday the 29th, I am finally having surgery to repair my ruptured Achilles tendon. The surgery has been put off three times due to "no elective surgeries". It looks like it will finally happen so I am asking for your thoughts and prayers for the surgery and recovery. I assure you that you are all in my prayers daily.


