"PUSHED" OUT ON MISSION

There is a delightful character in the original Dr. Dolittle Tales called the "Pushmi-Pullyu." It is a beast with two identical halves, with a head at each end. No matter which direction the beast walks, one end is the "push me" and the other is the "pull you." Today's feast is a bit like that in the life of the church. In the book of the Acts of the Apostles, it is the ascension of Christ that calls for the Holy Spirit, which consequently sends or "pushes" the church out on its mission. This is the message that we hear from the angels today as they tell the friends of Jesus not to look up into the clouds, but to get busy. It is the message of Jesus himself in Matthew's Gospel, as he sends them out to baptize. He also tells them, "I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). And it is this message, confident in faith that Jesus has ascended to shouts of joy, that "pulls" us along to our final destiny. 





And I am sure you will agree that we all have different things that we deem important. Not only to ourselves, but also in our family, in our workplace, in our "community", in our society, in our country and even in the world. I say that because we all seem to be connected in recent times by the internet and all levels of communication that take place and are ever evolving. So what does all this mean? What are we supposed to do with so much "stuff" being brought before us? How do we segregate/separate what should be most important in our lives, while we accept that we are all different? What are the common denominators that make us all one?

I just took a short break from writing to watch/listen to the 9:30 live-streamed Mass at St. Francis. This Sunday, Mother's Day, Deacon Bob did the homily, and it was very good. Thanks Bob. He spoke about something that I find helps to answer the questions I wrote above. Questions I wrote before I listened to his homily. Deacon Bob spoke about the importance, especially during this trying time in our lives, the importance of "community". And this struck a note with me, especially during this unusual and unprecedented time in our lives.

I know that we have in the past always spoken about "community". And while "community" has always had a special meaning in our lives, especially in our "faith community" here at St. Francis. I also know that all of you out there who are reading this today, while you are literally spread all over the globe, have your own "faith community". The wonderful thing about "community" is that it doesn't matter where we are or what "community" we are associated with, we are all one in Jesus Christ. While this seems to be a subject I speak and write about a lot, I feel I can never say it enough. Remember the two most important Commandments; "love the Lord thy God and love your neighbor as yourselves". Yes, I know I say that a lot too, but again, I feel I can never say it enough. Today's (Sunday) Gospel, Jn 14:1-12, is a great teaching Gospel. It again shows how Jesus tried so hard to help His disciples understand "who He is and who they can be by believing in Him". How frustrating that must have been for Jesus to go through, especially after spending so much time with them. How they witnessed for three years all that Jesus had done and yet they still didn't seem to really understand "who Jesus was and is".

I am not sure how I would have related to Jesus Christ if I was there with Him 2,000 years ago. How about you? How would you have related to Jesus? Would you be asking Jesus the same questions that His disciples asked Him in today's Gospel? Maybe yes, maybe no. Whatever your answer might be, look at where we are today, 2,000 years later. For years, most of us have been taught the Word of God in school, in our homes, some in our workplaces, but most of all in our "faith communities". And for that, I know that I am most grateful. That I have been brought up in a country, in a "community" where my faith is not suppressed. We are free to "love the Lord thy God and love our neighbor as ourselves" without any fear of repercussions. So let's take advantage of that. Let's use our freedom to share our beliefs, not only within our own "community", but spread it throughout the world. Do that, and you will help allay all your fears.
