

THE RICHNESS OF THE SPIRIT


Students, and most adults recalling their school days, are familiar with the phrase "compare and contrast" that shows up from time to time on tests. Today we hear two different accounts of the giving of the Holy Spirit to the church. Let's contrast, then compare. Luke's account from Acts is filled with arresting details: the mighty wind from heaven, the tongues of flame, the miracle of different languages. John's account seems timid: fearful disciples, the wounded Christ, the expelling of breath from his risen body, not from the sky. Our literal, modern minds wonder which way it happened; our noisy culture probably makes us prefer the former. But if we compare the two, we find that the dazzling richness of the Spirit fills both accounts, for it is the very breath of the risen Christ, ascended to the sky in Luke, that appears to his disciples in John and sends his followers forth to carry on his mission of forgiving sin and proclaiming the mighty acts of God. 



May 19, 2020 Deacon's Corner

Jesus' disciples near the end of Jesus' time here on earth. As I wrote about in last week's DC, Jesus had to work very hard since His death on the Cross to allay the fears of His disciples, especially since He knew His time on earth was so limited. This gospel relates to the upcoming Feast of Pentecost in the Upper Room where Jesus calls upon the Holy Spirit to come and dwell within His disciples giving them the "faith, hope and love" to "go out and teach ye all nations". And we all know that it was not just the disciples who received the Holy Spirit, it was all of us. Yes, Jesus was talking to all of us each time He met with the disciples.

Last week I wrote about "how much do we love Jesus Christ?" Today I want to give you my thoughts regarding "hope" as described in today's gospel. In my Holman Bible Dictionary, "hope" is defined as: "hope is the confidence that what God has done for us in the past guarantees our participation to what God will do in the future".

We all know that "hope" is written throughout both the Old and New Testaments, I want to relate today mainly to the writings in the NT. In the NT, the writers spoke of Christ as the object and ground of "hope" for two reasons. First, that Jesus is the Messiah who has brought salvation by His life, death and Resurrection (lk 24:40). God's promises are fulfilled in Him. Second, the writers are aware of the unity between the Father and the Son, which is easy to understand as we would all have unity in our own families between father and son. You see, with the life, death and Resurrection of Jesus, "God was reconciling the world to Himself" (2Cor5:19). In this we come to realize that "hope" in the Son is one with "hope" in the Father.

Moving forward, we recognize that the NT affirms Christ's redemptive work in the past by His life, death and Resurrection. We also know that it looks forward to His return in the future to complete God's purpose. That makes

oday's gospel (Sunday), Jn 14:15-21 is one given to it easier for us to understand that the major emphasis on "hope" in the NT centers on the second coming of Jesus Christ. And this is what we are all here for. This is what our life is all about. Not our stature in society, our job, our income, our cars. No, we are all here to "love Jesus Christ and love our neighbor" in anticipation of our own eternal salvation. Eternal salvation that will be shared with God our Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Most important to remember is that through the death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ, God our Father has given His Son the power over sin and death. This is truly what our "hope" is for the future. I say all this because so many have become over burdened with the unprecedented and unusual time we live in. But don't forget that everything we go through is temporary. Remember the old saying; "this too shall pass". Well, remember that. Does that mean we should forget about what is taking place around us and in our lives. NO, certainly not. But as Christians, we must remember that "our hope is in the Lord", not in the temporary setbacks that we go through during our lifetime. On an encouraging note, I believe many of us have taken advantage of a number of ways during this pandemic to strengthen our "hope". I know that our daily live streamed Mass has attracted tens of thousands of viewers, meaning that daily Mass has been brought to so many more than

ever before. Also that our food pantry has been and

continues to be overwhelmed with benevolence and generosity of the entire community to help our neighbors

who need food help. These are just a couple of ways our

"faith community" has demonstrated "hope". Let's tie that "hope" in with more prayers for the future and I know

that we will all be better off.

O as Christians, we must remember that we our hope is in the Lord Market, not in the temporary setbacks that we go through during our lifetime.


