

FOOD FROM HEAVEN

God sustained the people of Israel for forty years in the desert with manna sent down from heaven, and Moses doesn't want them to forget it. God brought forth water from stone for them to drink, and Moses doesn't want them to forget this, either. 

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

It is no wonder that followers of Christ are called the Body of Christ. After all, sharing in the same spiritual food and sacred meal, they become what they eat and reveal the Divine Image. There is so much power for healing in the community of believers. Through the Eucharist, Christ becomes as present in those who have partaken of his Body and Blood as he has the elements themselves. The very presence of God touches the depths of the human soul and visits a part of us that no human being can ever hope to explore. We are God's. The sacred Eucharistic meal is a celebration of intimacy, the reunion of two loves in constant search of and longing for the other.

The community of believers receives the power and the presence to touch and heal in the name of the One they have welcomed within. It is now within their grasp to change the way life is lived and to more intentionally put into practice the Beatitudes that the Divine Guest has revealed. We are asked to be like Christ and work to create a world of sufficiency, where the greed of some no longer creates the want of others but where all of God's children can find a home and a place at the table of life. The One who makes a home within calls us to live a life that transforms. We are changed ourselves and now become agents of change for others. We are the Body of Christ. God is with us. We have been nourished.

y ood morning to all on this first Tuesday in June. After all we have been through during the first five months of this year, I believe we need a bit of rest and relaxation as opposed to more time of stress and anxiety which is being compounded by the violence we are seeing in our society. Think about it! We have been locked up in our houses, unable to shop or socialize, seen our economy take a nose-dive, unemployment sky-rocket to record highs and to top it all off, extreme violence in our streets. What the heck is going on? I ask myself that every day. I used to think I was pretty tuned in to the ways of our society and even our world, but now I question my ability to understand what is going on around us.

I remember vividly a saying I heard many years ago. The saying was; "it must be true, it is on the internet". While I never put much credence in that saying, in thinking about it, I sometimes think that there are people who actually believe it. Maybe I have given our society too much credit. I have always thought that we have the ability to discern the difference between "right and wrong". Over my many years on this earth, I have felt that I could make that distinction. Perhaps us "old timers" were brought up a bit differently than young people are today? I do know that good example in a family has and will always payoff as our children and g'children grow up. I have been witness to that in my own family and I thank God for that.

At yesterday's (Sunday) Mass, which was the Feast of Pentecost, Fr. Ryan talked about the fruits and gifts of the Holy Spirit. We all know that Pentecost is the 50 day culmination of the Easter Season when the Holy Spirit comes down to dwell within Jesus' disciples. And we all know that we are all disciples of Jesus, therefore the Holy Spirit dwells within all of us, all the time. Today I want to talk about the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit. > The changes we have all experienced in the near past is something that, as I have said before, has been unprecedented and unusual in all of our lifetimes. And while the "stay-at-home orders" seem to be relaxing a bit and our world is trying to find what our "new normal" might entail for the future, this recent wave of violence in the streets is something that needs the "help of Our Lord". That brought to mind Paul's fruits of the Holy Spirit. Think about it, go back and read them again. Paul wrote this 2,000 years ago amid his own strife, uncertain times for Christians and all of the Roman Empire, and yet his words clearly define the standard we should all be applying to our daily lives. Like many things I write about, "easy to say, harder to do".

> Going back to the statement; "it must be true, it is on the internet". Sometimes I think we all react way too quickly to things that go on around us. We are all prone to being a little judgmental, probably more than we should be. I know I have fallen into that trap a few times. How about you? Doesn't make us bad, I just believe there is a better way to live our lives. Let's slow down a bit, give more discernment to things that are taking place around us. Apply some of our experiences of the past in determining how we proceed with our future. And my suggestion is to read again Paul's fruits of the Holy Spirit. It doesn't take long and it is a great guide to bringing some peace and harmony in our lives and back into society. You see, I believe that if enough of us do abide in the fruits of the Holy Spirit, our lives will change for the better as will the world around us.
