

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

A single mother who has a child with special needs works two jobs and sacrifices much of her own pleasures in order to be available for her son. Being the best mother possible is important to her and brings her joy. We are willing to make great and often heroic sacrifices for those people and things that matter most to us. Unless there is something of obvious importance to us in our immediate path, we can easily approach life in a more haphazard and chaotic way. We jump from one thing to another, responding to whatever it is that is competing for our attention at that moment. When everything is important, nothing is important.

If we do not wear the right pair of glasses, we can get all too easily caught up in the superficial stuff and neglect paying attention to the things that really matter. The kingdom of God is like the pearl of great price that is worth selling everything for so that it can be obtained. Based on where I invest my time and energy each day, I really wonder whether I am serving God's kingdom or my own. Have you ever considered tracking how you spend your



time? You may be surprised! We allow our agendas to set the clock of our lives. We forget that joy and a true sense of purpose are not going to be found in following that timepiece. Joy is the expression of the happiness that is discovered when living in the kingdom of God. When our agenda matches God, not only do we leap for joy but God leaps with delight as well. Our wellbeing is what matters most to God.

Can you imagine God delighting in you? It is easy to deaden our senses to the whole reality of God and the joy that living the Gospel can bring. The demands

of secular life and the agendas competing for our attention can quickly do that. We can get tired and spiritually apathetic. But if we can see our way through all of the conflicting voices and hear the voice of God, we can rediscover our zeal and passion and redirect our efforts. When we begin to see as God sees, we can rise each day and notice what really needs our attention and embrace it with exuberance. Be careful, though. It may not be what we originally had on our list. Responding to it, however, will be worth putting everything else aside.



Deacon's Corner

hope you all remember last week's DC. The last sentence said "I have run out of room but will continue it next week". Well, here we are at "next week". I don't often have to continue a reflection to the next week, but I felt this subject; "do not be discouraged", was a topic that needs further emphasis. You recall the last sentence in last week's DC was from Proverbs 4:25 which reads; "let your eyes look directly forward, and your gaze be straight before you". That phrase is so true in so many ways.

I often preach about yesterday, today and tomorrow. And I always refer to that in saying yesterday is already done, we cannot change it. Tomorrow is not yet here, so do not be concerned about it. All we have is today, so let's deal with it. If we apply the verse from Proverbs above, we will always be looking forward. If we are looking back, we might walk off a cliff or walk into a wall. We might also become "discouraged" in thinking about the past and what we might have done differently. If we live in that space, we can definitely become "discouraged". My suggestion, since I have been in that space in the past, is to "let go and let God". What I mean by that is what I wrote last week. We must "trust" our life to be in the "hands of Our Father". No matter what happens, no matter what takes place, no matter how bad we feel about the circumstance, we must have "faith" in our life to be in the "hands of Our Father".

I know that is easier said than done, but remember our life here on earth is temporary. Our true goal in this life is "eternal life with Our Father". I have often wondered what time means to Our Lord. What I mean by that is if, perhaps, I end up in Purgatory, how long will I be there? Have you ever thought about that? Since we have our own idea of what time is, we don't know how God looks at time. Perhaps what we consider a lifetime might only be a blink of God's eye. That is one reason I "trust" in Our Lord. After all, He has said; "come, I have prepared a place for you". And while I believe we have to earn that

hope you all remember last week's DC. The last place, living in His Word will gain us that place in Heaven.

So I ask you as I ask myself so often, what keeps us from staying on our Road to Salvation? I think we all know the answer. Of course, it is sin. It is the evil one who does everything in his power to knock us off our Road to Salvation. But we must always remember that Jesus Christ died on the Cross so that our sins can be forgiven. He rose again from the dead so that we might have life here on earth and life eternal when our time here is over. Knowing this and believing this, how can we ever get "discouraged"? How can we ever be "afraid"?

Those two things, "discouraged" and "fear" are the two emotions that the evil one tries to sell us every day. These two emotions lead to lack of trust, lack of believing, lack of faith. The evil one knows that if we succumb to those two emotions, he has conquered us. For if we do not have trust, if we don't believe, if we don't have faith, we cannot love Our Lord. And if we cannot love Our Lord, we cannot have eternal life. While this sounds very disheartening, the answer to overcome this is simple. I know all who are reading this know the answer and the only way to implement it is to continue to look forward in our daily life. We cannot and should not look behind and try to second guess what happened yesterday.

I want to repeat the verse from Joshua I used last week. Joshua 1:9 says; "haven't I commanded you; be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or discouraged, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go". We all know that this is true. The biggest challenge is to resign ourselves to that. That God dwells within us 24/7 in the form of the Holy Spirit to love and protect us from all evil. All we have to do is ask for His help and I promise you He will be there for you always.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturdays between 11am and Noon.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: This Sacrament offers the Lord's healing strength and peace to anyone who is seriously or chronically ill, hospitalized, or about to undergo surgery. Please contact the Ministry Center 847-438-6622, or Fr. Ryan at 847-726-4723 if you wish to have someone anointed, or the Last Rites near death.

Sacrament of Marriage: Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance and no other plans should be finalized until the Parish Priest or Deacon has been consulted.
