OUR DEEPEST NEEDS

The word of God serves up a tremendous feast for us today. Isaiah beckons all who hunger and thirst to come to the Lord for satisfaction. The psalmist cries out, "The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers all our needs" (Psalm 145:16). Saint Paul tells us that nothing can separate us from the love of God. Finally, in the Gospel, we hear the story of the miraculous feeding of over five thousand people from a mere five loaves and two fish. Most of us have our material needs met on a day-to-day basis. These scriptures, nevertheless, have much to say to the contemporary believer. We must ask ourselves, "Where are my deepest hungers? Where are my thirsts?" After material needs are satisfied and, in some cases, over-satisfied, many people still experience a deep longing for spiritual balance and well-being. GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Many people in our world are hungry and thirsty. This hunger and thirst go well beyond physical needs for food, security, and shelter. Many are emotionally and spiritually parched, too. Behind every act of violence is a soul who hungers. People live with relationships that actually starve them. They are abused, exploited, disrespected, laughed at, and marginalized. There is a lot of confusion and inner pain that needs to be acknowledged and expressed. We all long to be understood and loved, even when our inner demons or who I am make it difficult to be. Do you live with inner confusion and pain? Folks often wander through life without any real direction or purpose and take their cues from what seems satisfying or popular at the moment. The deeper dots of our lives can easily remain unconnected, and we can find ourselves without grounding, purpose, or real happiness. Life becomes shallow and without real purpose as we hunger and thirst for an ultimate love.

It's easier to see the physical hungers and thirsts. We try to respond to these as best we can. Much more needs to be done. With



all that God's earth can provide, nobody ought to face sleep at night with a belly that's empty. It's sinful. It's unjust. But isn't all hunger unjust? It doesn't need to be, and it should not be. Just as no one ought to be physically hungry and thirsty, there is really no need to be emotionally or spiritually deficient either. If we have more privileges at our fingertips, it is easier to try to satisfy our emotional and spiritual hungers and thirst by acting on impulse or self-indulgence, carelessly following passions, or by seeking self-destructive ways to dull the ache of emptiness.

Folks need to know where to look for nourishment and need the right friends to help them find it. We may not think that we have enough to respond to and to satisfy all of the needs, but we do. It doesn't take much. Five loaves and two fish provided for a huge crowd. With God, all things are possible. Our faith provides the direction for where God's children must go to find the nourishment they seek. It also tells us how to structure life so that justice and equity can be a reality for all. It also tells us how to respond to pain, sinfulness, and confusion. Come to the water and then help another get there.



Dear Brothers,

Last month, Cardinal Cupich announced our intent 5. We call all people within our communities to to reopen Catholic schools for face-to-face classes this fall. Since this announcement, the Office of Catholic Schools (OCS) has been working hard to develop our specific plan for school reopening. The planning process included consultation with several groups, including the Archdiocesan COVID-19 Task Force, our panel of medical experts, state and local officials, priests, principals, and school parents.

On behalf of the Office of Catholic Schools, I am very pleased to release the plan to you today. Major documents associated with the plan, which are posted to a dedicated Schools Reopening and Resources page on IZZY, include the following:

- Reopening with Trust: A Planning Framework for the 2020/21 School Year
- School Reopening Principal Checklist
- School Reopening Certification Form
- School Reopening PPE and Cleaning Supplies

It is important to note that the plan is based on fundamental principles:

- 1. The safety and wellbeing of all our students and If your parish or school receives media inquiries, faculty is and will remain the first priority.
- 2. Everything possible will be done to timely reopen our school buildings and provide a safe, faithfilled, high-quality education for our students.
- 3. The current situation in Illinois remains fragile. While much has been achieved over the past several months, there remains the potential that the gains could be lost if we are not collectively prudent and cautious with how we proceed.
- 4. The trust our school families place in us is sacred and as with all aspects of our ministry Peace, our reopening efforts will move forward with complete transparency and clear, open lines of communication.

exercise faithful citizenship and ask that each family take personal responsibility for the common good as well as their own safety.

This plan has been distributed to all principals with more specific instructions. Again, the plan is posted to IZZY; other peripheral documents referenced in the plan (such as the School Employee FAQ) will be posted there, as well.

A Plan Summary and Parent FAQ will be distributed to school families tomorrow (Friday, July 10). Please do not release the Plan Summary and Parent FAQ until it is released by the OCS tomorrow. The OCS will continue to provide communications and support to principals, school employees, and parents throughout the remainder of the summer.

Additionally, in constructing the school reopening plan, OCS did work in collaboration with the Office of Lifelong Formation (OLF), which is developing the reopening plan for Parish Religious Education programs. More information about the RE reopening plan will be distributed by the OLF at a later date.



Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturdays between 11am and Noon.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: This Sacrament offers the Lord's healing strength and peace to anyone who is seriously or chronically ill, hospitalized, or about to undergo surgery. Please contact the Ministry Center 847-438-6622, or Fr. Ryan at 847-726-4723 if you wish to have someone anointed, or the Last Rites near death.

Sacrament of Marriage: Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance and no other plans should be finalized until the Parish Priest or Deacon has been consulted.
