Be still and know that I am God. Silence is sacred. Silence speaks the language of the soul and is the foundation of all life and eternity itself. Silence takes us beyond the limits of our minds and allows us to seek and to love the essence of all love, perfect love, and being. In silence, we can be non-verbally present to things and to God in ways that words cannot accomplish. We can discover, encounter, and be present to truths that our minds struggle to conceive and then set aside the boxes we put around things when comprehending them is challenging. We can know the unknowable and touch eternity when we encounter the core silence in our souls.

We can do this even on a noisy street and in the midst of the greatest distraction. Once we have made friends with silence, the rambling noise of the world no longer seems to matter, and we can carry a deep forgiving peace within us, even when physical silence cannot be found. We know that we are loved, cared for, sustained, nourished, embraced, and carried. There is nothing to fear in silence, and I can be present to



myself in the same way that God is present to me. I can see myself as God sees me. All of my faults, weaknesses, imperfections, failings, and sinfulness melt away in the abundance of God's mercy. All of the worldly things we see as being important no longer are.

It is in silence that all of the barriers that divide us disappear. There is no more "yours" and "mine" but only the oneness of "ours." There is no longer a need to "figure things out," and we tap into our desire to simply let things be. Silence is creative and powerful and gives us hope. Silence is God's greatest blessing.

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." - Mt 11:28-30

think about. A good friend, after recently reading the Deacon's Corner, sent me some "words of wisdom" that I thought would be a good topic to write about. It went something like this.

When anyone asks me how I am today, I tell them it is the greatest day of my life, TODAY IS A GIFT. Many times that same person will ask, why is today a gift? The answer is quite simple, I tell them; YESTERDAY IS HISTORY, TOMORROW IS A MYSTERY AND TODAY IS A GIFT. That is why we refer to "today" as a present. (Thanks, Jack)

In thinking more about this concept, "today as a present" is kind of a double-entendre, which Webster defines as a word or group of words having two meanings. Let's think about "today as a present" in that capacity. To me the "present" means now, in the moment, something we experience or are going through at this time. It can also mean something in the form of a gift, such as a birthday "present" or a Christmas "present". Obviously, we have all experienced both types of meanings many times in our lives, but how many times have we looked at the most obvious "gift" that we have all been given by our Heavenly God and Father? I know for myself, and perhaps many who are reading this today, we sometimes take this "gift" for granted. Not necessarily because we mean to, not because we don't appreciate this "gift" from God, but maybe it is as simple as we have just gotten used to God being "present" for us whenever we need Him and even when we don't.

Many times in homilies and the DC, I spoke about the presence of both good and evil constantly in our lives. I likened it to a angel sitting on our right shoulder and

oing back through the past Deacon's Corners, the evil one sitting on our left shoulder, each of them I found this and thought it would be a good to whispering in our ear to do what they are suggesting. So no matter how much we appreciate the "gift" of God's presence in our lives daily, we must always remember that the evil one is always there too trying to pull us off course, to move us in the wrong direction away from God. So I urge you, as I do myself so many times each day, to stay on course, listen to the angel in the right ear and thank God for the "greatest gift ever given" to us.

> Having just completed the celebration of Easter, the Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior, and Pentecost, we should focus intently on the "greatest gift ever given" to us. I can liken this "gift" to be like the key to the door that we could never open on our own, yet with His death and Resurrection, Jesus opened the door to Paradise for us all. All He asks in return is that we love Him and live in the State of Grace (another topic for the future).

> Remember, no matter how hard we try, we cannot change HISTORY. Nor can we predict the future which is a MYSTERY. But what we can do is accept the "gift of today" as a present from God so when we get up in the morning we can say; TODAY IS THE GREATEST DAY OF MY LIFE. I know as I get on in years, as many of us reading this have being "senior citizens" (whatever that really means) I have come to appreciate all that God has given me in my life. I have said many times in homilies and discussions with friends that; "if we are happy with where we are today, this moment in time, then all that has happened in our lives in the past was good and we can accept as a gift from God".
