

THE CROSS OF JESUS

The perception of a cross changed dramatically after Jesus' crucifixion. Before that event, death on a cross was not only horrible, it was degrading. It was a penalty reserved only for the most wretched of criminals. The word "glory" would not have found its way into the same sentence containing the word "cross." But all that changed with Jesus. Over time, believers began to venerate and honor the cross. They painted, sculpted, and carved images of it. Many lost their own lives for their association with it. Today our reverence for and relationship with the cross recalls little of the contempt originally associated with it. As it has been through the ages, it is our perception of the cross that determines how we follow Jesus.

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Secular pursuits only bring a temporary amount of satisfaction and fulfillment. As much as we may think that achieving worldly success, economic security, personal well-being, and self-fulfillment are worthy goals to obtain, they all are dependent on external variables and can lead to emptiness. We are trained to be very pragmatic and productive. Unless we are able to check off all of the boxes or comply with specific measurable requirements, our value and worth becomes questionable. Corporations, educational institutions, systems, structures, and secular ideology rarely consider deeper, more spiritual, and human contributions a person can and needs to make.

To the secular mind, the wisdom and ideals of the Gospel are making less and less sense. Consider for a moment this question: "What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?" While Jesus is asking this very challenging question to people who are considering his message, many in our world are in a quite different place. Whether we realize it, many folks are asking a much different question. Why would you not want to gain the whole world and secure your life? If you look at where a lot of folks are investing their time, energy, and resources, it becomes obvious where current priorities rest.



Modern day comforts and possibilities are backing us out of our relationship with God. The fire burning in every human heart is trying to find its satisfaction in the things that humans have created and not God. Being altruistic and offering compassion for those most in need becomes a political responsibility or responsible gesture. We realize that our hearts need to be centered on something and someone who calls us out of ourselves, but we struggle and battle with naming the source of that call. God places the desire to seek. find, and love Him in the core of every soul. We are not abandoned and left to fend for ourselves. But we can easily get confused. We know that

Dear Rev. David F. Ryan,

I hope you and your loved ones are safe and well during these challenging times. The events of the last few weeks and months rest heavy on our hearts, especially for those most in need.

Sadly, about five children die every day in America from abuse and neglect. **Maryville Crisis Nursery** is an innovative program designed to help parents or guardians get through stressful times. We offer up to 72 hours, around the clock, child care for children ages birth to 6 years of age. Families facing medical emergencies, mental illness, homelessness, domestic violence or other crises often have nowhere to turn to. Maryville's Crisis Nursery is free of charge and provides a safe and loving environment for their children. Most recently, first responders and essential workers for COVID-19 relied on the Crisis Nursery for emergency child care.

A second program, our **Children's Healthcare Center**, is a transitional healthcare facility. Tragically, some children with complex medical needs are compelled to leave hospitals well before their families are able to care for them. Our team of pediatricians, nurses and medical providers deliver 24-hour nursing care for children ages birth to 21.

Father, it is often the ones we least expect who are in the most need. AUGUST 25, 2020 Deacon's Corner

his week's DC is based on the gospel and homily I experienced and are still experiencing a pandemic, If you don't remember it or might not have heard it, I suggest you grab your bible and read it before you read this DC. I believe this is one of the most important gospels written for a number of reasons which I am about to write about.

In this gospel, Jesus asks His disciples; "who do you say that I am?" Peter answers Jesus; "You are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God". Peter's answer surprises the other disciples since the Messiah hasn't been fully explained at this time in Jesus' ministry. Jesus tells Peter that "flesh and blood could not answer but this came from the Father". At this time, the Messiah, which means "anointed one" could be a king, or a warrior or a prophet, but no one knew since the evolution of the Messiah was to be lived out in human form. And Peter could not have known Jesus was the Messiah except to have this spiritual revelation from God, our Father.

The most important take away from this gospel is that it is truly the beginning of our Church. Some think that the Crucifixion or the Resurrection or the last of three times Jesus visited His disciples in the upper room behind locked doors may have been the beginning of the Church on earth. But this gospel clearly explains the beginning when Jesus told Peter; "Thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build My Church and the gates of Hell shall not prevail against it". This is truly the beginning of our Church on earth.

So we must ask ourselves, what does the call to follow Jesus look like for us in this moment? We all have our own way of answering that question. But we must look at the times we live in now. You see, I believe that the calling each of us have to follow Jesus may be somewhat the same, the road we all follow changes sometimes more than we would like. Our lives are filled with continuing changes. Think about it, in the recent past we have

did this past Sunday. The gospel was Mt 16: 13-20. social mayhem and chaos, political unrest and the list goes on. What we might have been used to in the past may not necessarily work today or tomorrow.

> While things in our lives and our Church have changed over time, the more important things have remained the same. In this gospel, Jesus said to Peter; "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven". That got me thinking about the terms "bind" and "loose". This was something Jesus practiced throughout His three year ministry. He would "bind" certain things, those things that would be most important and at the center of His teachings. For instance, "love the Lord thy God with your heart, mind, soul and strength, and love your neighbor as yourself". Jesus bound these two commandments as the most important. And He "loosed" the other commandments. Not diminishing the importance of the other commandments, but stressing how important the two are in our lives and on our road to salvation. The two commandments that Jesus "bound" are most important because they are based on LOVE.

> And lastly, Peter was on to something when he said Jesus was "the Messiah, the Son of the Living God". That is something we tend to forget. That God is a "living God". Perhaps we think that the Church is frozen in the past or remains the way it used to be. We must remember that God, our Father, is still moving in our lives, working in the world around us in ways that are new. It is our responsibility to discern how God is living and moving and working in our lives. We all have the same opportunity to "walk with Our Lord", it is a journey worth embarking upon and it is never to late to begin.




