

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

It's all about reconciliation and conversion, not punishment. Relationships are not static adventures but wonderful gifts that continue to develop, grow, change, and mature. We are meant to be social beings, so isolating ourselves from others is rarely helpful. But, because human beings are on the one hand tremendously gifted. talented, and blessed creations, they are on the other also flawed, broken, and sinful. We all need to humbly admit that we are works in progress and not only capable of enriching each other's lives but causing deep hurts and wounds as well. Hence, we always need to be reconciled. We are always growing, changing, and expanding our knowledge of who we are and how we are meant to share life together.

Because reconciliation and conversion are always part of the mix of life, honesty is crucial. Without honesty, we can easily find ourselves living a lie and causing more harm than good. Being able to freely share our feelings, especially those involving pain and hurt, is a charism necessary to pursue and an art to learn. When we are wronged or wrong someone else, we do not enjoy the confrontation that can and needs to come. We are taught to keep



our feelings to ourselves, especially when they are negative, and we tend to avoid difficult conversations. Hence, we never really learn how to confront another, successfully resolve conflict, find reconciliation, and welcome conversion. When we hurt or wrong someone, it does not mean that we are a bad or sinful person who deserves only punishment and excommunication. Quite the opposite! We are simply a human person who can make poor choices and sin and can be forgiven. We can restore and deepen the relationship that has been affected and find our way home again.

Jesus clearly wants to avoid shame because it has no purpose in achieving reconciliation and conversion. All broken relationships deserve a chance at reconciliation. Every person has room for growth and a need for conversion. We have to learn to be okay with honesty and not be afraid to hear and process what someone needs to say, even if it is difficult for us to hear. Severing a relationship, both personally or with the church community as a whole, ought to definitely be a last resort and only pursued when all else has failed.

These teens volunteered to come to St Francis de Sales Church almost every day this summer. We live streamed our daily noon Masses and our Sunday 9am Masses through Facebook and YouTube.

Allison welcomed people each day with a smile as they came back to our in-person Masses. She warmly greeted those arriving for Mass while following the safety guidelines set in place by our archdiocese.

The tech team expertly handled all aspects of live streaming including the video camera, video streaming controls, software and trouble shooting any sound issues.

They worked as a team and took full responsibility for ensuring that people not only from the Lake Zurich community, but from all across the country, were able to participate in our Masses, Rosaries, Children's Bible Study and Adoration.

And then, if that was not enough, they showed up again and again to enable many to experience the joy of the sacraments through multiple services of 1st Communion, Children's Catechumenate, Adult Confirmation and Teen Confirmation both by checking people into the events as well as enabling live streaming for all those who could not attend in person. Some Sundays they helped at three different events throughout the day.

They worked to ensure everyone had an excellent experience by troubleshooting issues when they arose, constantly looking for ways to improve technique and even adding Mass responses and comments for audience participation.

They all went above and beyond

These teens have been a very important part of a team which has helped spread the Good News of Jesus both in person and through technology. Since March 15th, we have been streaming weekday noon Masses as well as the Sunday 9:00am Mass.

As of August 28th there have been over 150,000 Facebook and Youtube views.

And with some upcoming health challenges coming my way this week, "trust" has been thrust to the forefront of my thoughts, which has me thinking much more deeply about this concept.

It is also ironic that July 30th was the sixty-fourth anniversary of the phrase "In God we trust" which was adopted in 1956 at the direction of President Dwight Eisenhower to be used on US currency. This phrase has been the subject of much scrutiny over the past 64 years but I would prefer to look at "trust" as something much more personal as we can apply it to our daily lives. And while we look at "trust" from a personal perspective, the phrase "In God we trust" really plays an important role.

Webster defines "trust" as Total confidence in the integrity, ability, and good character of another. And as we have progressed through our lives from childhood to adults, "trust" has really taken on some very important meanings but, I believe, they can all be defined as Webster did above even though they seemed to be so different at the time.

If we look at "trust" from the eyes we had when we were children, one might say that most of our "trust" was put in the hands of our parents. And for me looking back in time, I feel that some "trust" was put in the hands of our teachers, who were mostly nuns and priests. We also put some of that "trust" in policemen, firemen, doctors, nurses, etc. And most important of all, we had "trust" in Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. So what has changed as we have gotten into our adult years? What has brought us to NOT "trust" so many of those we had trusted in the past?

One might think that as we progressed in age and gained wisdom (at least I think we did) that "trust" was something that would be easier for us as opposed to getting harder.

But as society has put up so many road blocks to "trust", I beg the question; "what did Our Lord ever do that would ever lessen our 'trust' in Him?" If you are like me, you would agree that there is no answer to that question. For over time, Our Lord has not changed. His teachings have not changed. His doctrine has not changed. BUT WE HAVE CHANGED. And I am not sure if our change has always been for our own betterment. Remember that I am not judging you, only myself. But if you see some possible similarities to your life as I have presented here, all the better.

So the challenge I see before us is to set aside the norms of society that we are immersed in on a daily basis. Does that mean that we have to reject society as we know it? No it does not. But it does give us the opportunity to live our own lives, not the lives of those around us! Don't be afraid to "trust" what you truly believe is right and correct, especially for your family. And while I know that sometimes that is difficult to do, I can promise you from my own experience, that children and family members will someday say "thanks" after they realize that they can "trust" the decisions you make are for their best interests.

I truly believe that President Eisenhower was on the right track when he enacted "In God we trust" to be put on all US currency. Perhaps he realized, or maybe not, what impact that phrase could and would have on the people of the United States. And at least for me, having "trust" in God is the single most important thing that has taken place in my life, from my childhood up and until today as you read this Deacon's Corner. Put your "trust" in God and I promise you that every day will be a happier and more fulfilling experience for everyone.


