



## Angels Among Us

It was great to see school leadership at



Leadership Day. Thank you for your attention during the OPCY presentation. Bishop Perry's homily was a clear reminder of the sacredness of our jobs.

First, an apology. I misspoke about volunteer coaches needing fingerprints. They do not! They need to take the mandated reporter training regardless of their employment status. Only coaches paid, with either salary or stipend, are required to have fingerprints.

### Don't Forget

Please use this time to verify compliance of all returning employees. Ask Site Administrators to notice if the person is "Approved." If an application has "status unassigned" or "consult required" please follow up with Safe Environment Office to determine what issue is preventing us from approving the person's application.

To be as transparent as possible, perhaps it would be good to include in the school parent handbook some language about the responsibility of mandated reporters. Suggested wording:

"As Mandated Reporters in the State of Illinois, school personnel (and clergy) are mandated to report any suspicion of abuse or neglect to the Department of Children and Family Services for their possible investigation. Mandated Reporter may not investigate the veracity of an allegation, as that is the responsibility of DCFS. Mandated Reporters take seriously their responsibility to help a child in need."

It is hard for people to make a call. It is hard when a call has been made. This notice might make parents aware of our responsibility to take care of their children and report when necessary.

### More changes?

The Office for the Protection of Children and Youth has been notified that there will be an imminent change in the eApps system. It is a matter of sooner or later. While we do not have the details at this time, we will work closely with schools and parishes on this unexpected change. Using Virtus for both employees and volunteers is under consideration. If you were a part of the migration of Volunteers from eApps to Virtus, you will understand the need to make sure all the information in eApps is correct and up to date.

The good news is Site Administrators will have only one database with which to work. New employees and volunteers will have to create only one account in one database. While eApps charged an initial fee as well as an annual maintenance fee, Virtus is no cost to parishes and schools.



The Church uses these precepts to remind us that Christian life requires commitment to prayer and active participation in the liturgy and sacraments. If we fall below this bareminimum level, we can't rightly consider ourselves to be in full communion with the Catholic Church. Each of these precepts of the Catholic Church is a requirement. Together with the 10 Commandments, they represent the minimum level of moral living. Intentional violation of the precepts or the Commandments is a grave matter, meaning a moral sin.


