

GOD IS ON THE SIDE OF THE POOR

Two of today's readings make it quite clear that God is on the side of the poor. Amos describes in detail the exploitation of the poor and needy. The psalm repeats that God acts to benefit the poor and lowly. But Luke turns things upside down, telling a tale of a conflicted steward, about to be fired, who demonstrates his cleverness and is rewarded. Like the community to whom Paul writes in Timothy, these readings are personal, directed to believers, members of the Jewish and Christian communities, who struggle to deal with personal choices about how to conduct their lives. They offer an outline for how God wishes us to live in a world as complicated and as confusing as our own.

Jeacon's Corner

his week I want to talk about hope. Webster defines taken around the world, wars everywhere and terrorist hope as 1. to expect with confidence, 2. to desire with expectation of obtainment. When I think about hope, I usually think of it in a secular way, such as I hope to see you soon, I hope I get this new job, or I hope my kids are OK. Perhaps you do also. But now let's look at hope as it pertains to our own spiritual journey by asking God, our Father, to help us renew our hope in Him. For He has given us the greatest hope of all with the death and resurrection of His Son, Jesus Christ, who gives us the "hope for eternal salvation".

Have you ever wondered why it is so important to hope in God? Many of us place our hope in our parents when we are young, our peers when we are teenagers and in our careers as we mature. Unfortunately, many of us learn too late it is a waste of time to place our hope in anyone other than Jesus Christ. There is nothing sadder than to see a person whose best hopes have been dashed to pieces. And that is exactly what will happen to us if we do not learn to place our hope in God.

If we look around us, it is easy to see we live in a world that struggles in hopelessness. If you talk to people on a daily basis, you are probably going to get in a conversation with someone who is going to tell you they are discouraged about something. Hopeful people have an eager expectation of God's continuous direction, protection and blessing of our lives. Spiritual hope helps us transfer our trust away from fallible people and look to the unfailing promises of God. You see the Good News is if we live in Jesus Christ, we live in a constant state of hope and the pains of this world will give way to the painless and joyful reality of Heaven. The promise is in time, Jesus Christ will dry all of our tears. The good news for those who are in Jesus Christ is that you always have hope.





His work has included counseling with gang members and their families and with adult children of alcoholics both in private therapy and in the 12Step Programs. This work has brought him to minister to survivors of physical and sexual abuse. As a follower of St. Francis of Assisi, Friar Johnpaul's love of the poor and outcasts is only surpassed by his love of the scripture. This comes through his many speaking and preaching engagements. Friar Johnpaul has lectured and preached throughout The United States and internationally. He formerly held the position of Vice President of Spiritual Life and Pastoral Counseling at Hales Franciscan High School on the south side of Chicago. Friar Johnpaul is a pastoral associate and preacher at Holy Family Parish in Inverness. Formerly the assistant vocation director for his Franciscan order, he now serves as chaplain for the Illinois State Police.
