



HEALING AND SALVATION

The readings today speak of healing and salvation. In Second Kings, Naaman, a commander of the army of the king of Syria, develops leprosy. He goes to a stranger, a prophet from Israel, when no one else can cure his disease. Much to his surprise, after a simple bath in the river, he is cured. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus cures ten lepers and sends them to the priest. Only one, a Samaritan, returns to thank Jesus for his cure and only he hears the words, "Your faith has saved you." The psalm and Timothy remind us that salvation involves justice, kindness, and faithfulness and forever links us with Jesus. In a world as broken as ours, both healing and salvation are necessary. 


Lie #3: God is not a Good Father

31st PLEDGE UPDATE & PAYMENTS COMPLETED

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parishioners, Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The remaining major projects are the new flooring design in the Church. We had hoped by Christmas 2018 to have completed the new Church flooring, but our plans and finances are scheduled for 2019. A monument on the site of the first Church building has been erected in remembrance of the first church in the parish and in honor of the generations of Catholics since 1949 in this faith community as disciples of this Body of Christ.

As pledges are made and paid, we will continue to address the one remaining project, which can be found on our parish website. See what this good parish has accomplished already in total pledges and number of donors! At this point in the Campaign, 886 donors helped us reach \$1,482,418 in total pledges. Total pledges paid are \$1,469,684. Balance due is \$12,735. It is not the intention of the Fix-It Campaign to place the parish in debt. As a parish, we spent 9 years paying off the \$3.8 million debt. We will only address the project as we raise the funds to pay. As Thomas Jefferson advised, "Never spend your money before you have it!" My Grandmother Ryan said the same message in her own way! Thank you to those who have already responded with a pledge toward the \$1.7 million goal. St. Francis de Sales has a long history of generous giving. I respectfully ask for the prayers, involvement, and sacrifice of many, if not all, in the parish in making a pledge towards the Fix-It Campaign in addition to the generosity you provide each Sunday offering. For example, if 1,000 parishioners pledge the suggested amount of \$850 per year for 2 years, we will reach our campaign goal immediately to conclude the project. Please, everyone, participate through a prayer and a pledge. All the funds we raise in the Fix-It Campaign stay within the parish. I want to express my gratitude to Deacon John Sfire, Jason Sfire, and Amie Paige of The Fidelity Group for doing an extensive study of our parish campus, as was presented in the Fix-It Campaign presentation. I have asked the Fidelity Group, under the leadership of Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire, to serve as Project Managers of the Fix-It Campaign. I also want to offer my appreciation for the guidance and involvement of Tom Purtell, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Marty Bush, Member of the PPC; Mike Carlino, Chair of the Parish Finance Council; Doug Samz, Member of the Parish Finance Council; Christine DePrez, Cornerstone Bank Liaison; Laura Angelini, Business Manager; and Pam Lynch, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

eacon's Corner

oday I want to talk about something that has gained alottraction over the recent years. That is "evangelism". Let us begin by the definition of "evangelism", which in the Holman Bible Dictionary is; "the active calling of people to respond to the message of grace and commit oneself to God in Jesus Christ". It is important to recognize that the word "evangelism" does not appear anywhere in the Bible, yet it seems to be woven into the very fabric of Scripture. It is derived from the Greek word, "euangelizo", meaning "to announce the good news".

I know when I was growing up, as many of you might recall, the word "evangelism" was pretty much used by the likes of Robert Shuler and his Crystal Palace and today by the likes of Joel Osteen. Some might recall in our younger days, Bishop Fulton J. Sheen on television "evangelizing" the Word of God, but never did we hear that concept used in school, or much in public until the recent past.

So why now, you might ask? Why has much of the direction of the Catholic Church focused on "evangelism"? The important thing to remember about "evangelism" is that it really isn't new at all. As a matter of fact, it goes back as far as the Old Testament in Kings, Psalms, Isaiah, etc., and carries on through the New Testament most certainly in Matthew, Mark, Luke, John and Paul. So it seems to me that we have known about "evangelism" in spreading the "good news of Jesus Christ" all of our lives. And now we are turning toward using the word, "evangelism" to help us do that.

Over time, I have used the word "evangelism" in many homilies, Deacon's Corners and conversation with others. And yet I find myself coming up short regarding "evangelism". What I mean by that is I know that in life, I am a "doer, not a talker". That phrase is pretty much selfexplanatory in its meaning. So I find myself focusing on "spreading the good news" not only by preaching and writing, but also by trying to live my life focused on the

"good news of Jesus Christ". Like many and being human, I know I sometimes fall short of my own expectations, but I always feel that the Holy Spirit is within to keep me on the Road to Salvation. All I have to do is ask for His help.

So how about you? Do you feel that you are practicing "evangelism" daily? Are you "spreading the good news" in all that you do, how you live, what you talk about? Give that question some thought and perhaps, like myself, you feel you could do a better job in that area of your life. As I say in so many homilies, the best way to practice "evangelism" is by the example we give in the life we lead. For me, it is like being on call 24/7 when it comes to "spreading the good news of Jesus Christ". And believe me, I know how difficult that can be with all of the distractions that are present in our lives every day.

At the end of every daily Mass, we say a prayer to St. Michael for our "protection from the wickedness and snares of the devil" "and cast into hell, Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls". And believe me, Our Lord knows how many distractions are put in front of us every day. But that is why He called upon the Holy Spirit on His last visit in the upper room to "dwell within His disciples" giving them the protection and power to "go out and teach ye all nations". Most important to remember is that Jesus was not just talking to the 12 or so disciples gathered in the upper room, He was speaking to ALL OF US, for we are all disciples of Jesus Christ. We have all been given the ability to "go out and teach ye all nations", to spread the "good news of Jesus Christ".

So let's take advantage of the greatest gift we could ever get, the Holy Spirit to dwell within us. And be sure and ask for His help every day as we try to live better today than we did yesterday, while practicing "evangelism".






