

Our readings today ponder two powerful truths: God is infinitely greater than we are; and God provides every kind of help so we can discover and share in God's glory. The reading from Wisdom reminds us that we are tiny compared to "the LORD of the whole universe." Nevertheless, God preserves and nurtures us out of perfect love. If we feel tiny, weak, and sinful compared to God, we are blessed! God's greatness sustains and strengthens us. Saint Paul encourages the Thessalonian Christians with the same message. He reminds them that God alone makes the Church holy. He prays that everything they undertake will be for the glory of God. Luke's Gospel shows us what this looks like in real life: Zacchaeus, feeling small and excluded, looks for Jesus. Jesus finds him and gives him the strength he needs to repent of his sins and glorify God.

Sunday, October 25th, 2019 THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parishioners, Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The remaining major projects are the new flooring design in the Church. We had hoped by Christmas 2018 to have completed the new Church flooring, but our plans and finances are scheduled for 2019. A monument on the site of the first Church building has been erected in remembrance of the first church in the parish and in honor of the generations of Catholics since 1949 in this faith community as disciples of this Body of Christ.

As pledges are made and paid, we will continue to address the one remaining project, which can be found on our parish website. See what this good parish has accomplished already in total pledges and number of donors! At this point in the Campaign, 908 donors helped us reach \$1,495,654 in total pledges. Total pledges paid are \$1,482,072. Balance due is \$13,582. It is not the intention of the Fix-It Campaign to place the parish in debt. As a parish, we spent 9 years paying off the \$3.8 million debt. We will only address the project as we raise the funds to pay. As Thomas Jefferson advised, "Never spend your money before you have it!" My Grandmother Ryan said the same message in her own way! For details on the campaign, including the presentation that was shown at Masses as well as the information on Charitable Giving Options, visit our parish website, www.stfrancislzparish.org. Thank you to those who have already responded with a pledge toward the \$1.7 million goal. St. Francis de Sales has a long history of generous giving. I respectfully ask for the prayers, involvement, and sacrifice of many, if not all, in the parish in making a pledge towards the Fix-It Campaign in addition to the generosity you provide each Sunday offering. For example, if 1,000 parishioners pledge the suggested amount of \$850 per year for 2 years, we will reach our campaign goal immediately to conclude the project. Please, everyone, participate through a prayer and a pledge. All the funds we raise in the Fix-It Campaign stay within the parish. I want to express my gratitude to Deacon John Sfire, Jason Sfire, and Amie Paige of The Fidelity Group for doing an extensive study of our parish campus, as was presented in the Fix-It Campaign presentation. I have asked the Fidelity Group, under the leadership of Deacon John Sfire and Jason Sfire, to serve as Project Managers of the Fix-It Campaign. I also want to offer my appreciation for the guidance and involvement of Tom Purtell, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), Marty Bush, Member of the PPC; Mike Carlino, Chair of the Parish Finance Council; Doug Samz, Member of the Parish Finance Council; Christine DePrez, Cornerstone Bank Liaison; Laura Angelini, Business Manager; and Pam Lynch, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

Our Annual Catholic Appeal is framed in the words of Jesus: Come, follow me. It is an invitation to be Christ for others and to live in a community of discipleship. As Christ's community we help to sustain Catholic schools and parishes in need, support programs of religious education, ministerial formation, and promote the protection of life and peace and justice. Through the Annual Appeal, we together support the efforts of Catholic Relief Services that cares for people across the globe who struggle and suffer because of natural disasters.

Since St. Francis de Sales elected to participate in the ACA Incentive Plan in 2017, your 2018 goal is reduced to 75% of your regular goal. Therefore, your 2018 goal is 4.5% of the previous year's offertory income. Your offertory income for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 was \$2,036,797. Therefore, your target is \$91,656. When parishioner contributions exceed the parish goal, St. Francis de Sales will receive a rebate of 100% of the funds donated over the goal. Just as you have my gratitude, you also have my prayers. Let us pray for one another. Together, as his disciples, we can do so much to bring Jesus to a world that is deeply in need. With God's grace and help, we will fulfill our mission.

The junior donated \$3,555 to the Advocate Charitable Foundation on Thursday, the proceeds from a garage sale fundraiser he led in September. The money is intended for use by the Cranial Facial Clinic at Advocate Children's Hospital in Park Ridge.

Luke, who was born with a cleft lip and palate, has endured 18 surgeries throughout his life. The most recent occurred two and a half weeks before the school year started, and involved having his jaw broken and reset. He is scheduled for another operation next summer.

Through his many surgeries and follow-up visits at the hospital, Luke noticed many other youngsters in similar situations. The September garage sale, which had a goal of raising \$1,000, was organized to help them.

He presented the fundraising check to two of his plastic surgeons, Dr. Frank Vicari and Dr. Sanjay Naran. Luke has been a patient of Dr. Vicari since he was 2 years old, and Dr. Naran conducted the most recent surgery.

"I am so happy that this garage sale raised substantial funds to help other kids at the Cranial Facial Clinic requiring surgery and medical attention," Luke said. "It was a lot of work and a lot of effort to make this garage sale successful, but I know that it was totally worth it."

One unexpected benefit of the garage sale effort was the influence Luke was able to have on a 5-year-old boy who also was born with a cleft lip and palate. His father saw a copy of the fundraiser flyer Luke created, and asked if he could meet with his son. The boy was scheduled to have surgery this month.

"Our families met and the little 5-year-old took immediately to Luke like an old friend," said Connie Snider, Luke's mother. "They played baseball together and it was a very special meeting. Luke definitely has a new little friend and more importantly, someone to help, as this little boy has quite a journey and many more surgeries in his future."

Luke serves as a mentor in Stevenson's Freshman Mentor Program, and also plays on the SHS baseball team.




