



Michelle Roesner, one of our many teens in this parish, was given a nudge in August of 2017 by God to embark upon a journey to create a project that would impact many homeless in Chicago. Ever since Michelle was little she has felt the desire to help the homeless. When God called her to create a project to do exactly that. Michelle responded with a resounding yes and began to prepare what she calls the "Proverbs 19:17 Project." This project will provide as many of the 64,000 homeless adults and 48,000 homeless children in Chicago with basic supplies to help them as we move into colder months. Michelle plans to create Care Kits consisting of nonperishable and protein filled food, water, blankets and basic hygiene products. While it is impossible to provide every single homeless person in Chicago with these Care Kits with solely one trip into the city, Michelle plans to reach as many of them as she can. She plans to speak at all of the masses on the weekend of November 17th and 18th in order to reach out for donations for her project. 

Our Annual Catholic Appeal is framed in the words of Jesus: Come, follow me. It is an invitation to be Christ for others and to live in a community of discipleship. As Christ's community we help to sustain Catholic schools and parishes in need, support programs of religious education, ministerial formation, and promote the protection of life and peace and justice. Since St. Francis de Sales elected to participate in the ACA Incentive Plan in 2017, your 2018 goal is reduced to 75% of your regular goal. 
