CONFIDENCE IN THE LORD

We are nearing the end of the liturgical year. Today's readings remind us that our own lives will draw to a close one day, and we can be certain that the Lord will encourage, strengthen, and save us—both now and at the last. The astonishing story of the Maccabees invigorates our faith as we behold an entire family willing to die rather than deny the Law of Moses. The psalm response echoes the faithful cries of the Maccabees: "I call upon you, for you will answer me, O God." That same confidence appears in Saint Paul's letter to the Thessalonians. "The Lord is faithful," he testifies; "he will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one." In the Gospel, Jesus explains just how long God's protection will endure. OCTOBER 29, 2019 Jeacon's Corner

chapter 34, was written of the sheep being forsaken by their shepherd and left for the wolves to prey upon. And as I gave this more thought, it struck a cord in my mind about wolves and sheep that I thought I would share with all of you in this week's Deacon's Corner.

I am sure we all recall many stories as we were growing up that related to the devouring nature of wolves, such as the three pigs, Little Red Riding Hood, and many more. But did we ever stop and think about the wolves as being the "left shoulder evil one" that I write about and use in homilies often? The evil one who works tirelessly to divert our attention away from our "Shepherd" who is Jesus Christ. Perhaps if you are like me, you never really considered that concept. So today let's look again at the "evil one" who is continually in our lives no matter how hard we work to keep him out.

Many of the stories from years gone by relating to wolves always had a reasonably happy ending. But in the scripture of Ezekiel, Our Lord was not happy with the selfinvolved shepherds that He had designated to tend to His flock, for they only seemed to care about taking care of themselves. And at the end of the day, Jesus Christ, our eternal Shepherd, comes to "gather up His flock and care for them". The great thing about this parable is that Jesus Christ makes this same caring and protection available to all of us each and every day. So the big question of the day is; "do we call upon our Shepherd to watch over and protect us?" Do we ask Our Lord and Savior to "keep the evil one out of our lives"?

Speaking for myself, as I do in my Deacon's Corner, I find that I do not ask for my Shepherd to watch over me as much as I could or should. I am not really sure why that is, except to say that perhaps my faith in God isn't as strong as it should be. That being the case, I am striving every day to become more "in tune with the ways of my Shepherd". You

n a recent parable I read last Wednesday from Ezekiel, see, the interesting part about this concept is that God, our Father, has made us all shepherds and also sheep. We are shepherds to each other, members of our families, coworkers in the workplace, even to strangers on the street. For I believe that we all have a responsibility to each other to live and preach the Word of God to each other. And as long as we live the best we can and work hard to maintain a relationship with Our Lord, I am convinced that God, our Father, will always be there as our Shepherd to protect us from the wolves of the world.

> So as we go on in our lives, let us always make a concerted effort to be a shepherd and a sheep. A shepherd to those around us by helping to guide them in the Way of the Lord and protect them as best we can by helping them (and ourselves) to overcome the wolves as we see them every day. Also, as a sheep, always keep asking God, our Father, to protect us and keep us, now and all the days of our lives. Remember, He is always ready to help us, all we have to do is ask! So what is holding us back? Why do we put off 'til tomorrow that which we can do today?

> One of the thoughts I had as to why we might put off 'til tomorrow that which we can do today is that if we are prepared to meet Our Lord and Savior, we might meet Him, meaning our journey on earth is completed. I know for myself that I sometimes feel that if I am not completely organized and prepared to meet Our Lord, if I am not ready for my journey to be complete, maybe I will be here to complete those tasks. That was the "old" me. Recent events in my life that have been life threatening in the past few years have given me a good reason to always be prepared, to be organized and ready to meet Our Lord. So the advice I can give to all of you is "do not put off 'til tomorrow that which you can do today".




