Dear Father Ryan,

Our Annual Catholic Appeal is framed in the words of Jesus: Come, follow me. It is an invitation to be Christ for others and to live in a community of discipleship. As Christ's community we help to sustain Catholic schools and parishes in need, support programs of religious education, ministerial formation, and promote the protection of life and peace and justice. Through the Annual Appeal, we together support the efforts of Catholic Relief Services that cares for people across the globe who struggle and suffer because of natural disasters.

Since St. Francis de Sales elected to participate in the ACA Incentive Plan in 2017, your 2018 goal is reduced to 75% of your regular goal. Therefore, your 2018 goal is 4.5% of the previous year's offertory income. Your offertory income for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 was \$2,036,797. Therefore, your target is \$91,656. When parishioner contributions exceed the parish goal, St. Francis de Sales will receive a rebate of 100% of the funds donated over the goal. Just as you have my gratitude, you also have my prayers. Township at St. Sharbel Maronite Catholic Church. Sunday was the beginning of the Liturgical Year and my homily, which follows, is a good DC so here it is. Also I flew to MN to watch my g'son's team beat St. Thomas 21-15 to get in the playoffs with a 9-1 record. They are now ranked 4th in the country in D3 standings. Next game this coming Saturday.

Picture a windy chilly day this past Spring and all of the Springs and you have tickets to opening day for the Cubs. We don't care what the weather is, be it cold, showers, snowy, windy. All we care about is that we have opening day tickets for the Cubs. They are always impossible to get. The ballpark is always sold out months in advance, but we were able to secure two tickets for opening day. We bundle up, pack some hot chocolate and make our way to the ballpark to watch the game. When we arrive, the ballpark is so crowded, sold-out game with standing room only. How excited and privileged we feel to be able to attend opening day, no matter what the weather brings.

So let's now think about this opening day here on November 11, 2018. We have had this opening day occur for us every year of our lives in the form of the beginning of our Liturgical Year, yet if the weather is a little bad or we don't feel up to par when we get up, we decide not to attend this opening day. We skip it because we know that our Church and its Liturgy will always be available to us every day. So why do we take our Church and its Liturgy so much for granted? Why do we feel that we can come and go as we please when it relates to worshipping Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ? Do you think Jesus took any days off or skipped



The last two weekends, Bobbi and I spent in Clinton being available during His life? I would wager a large amount of money that Jesus was available every minute of every day and most importantly, He still is available for us every minute of every day. Remember, Jesus said: "I will be with you always until the end of the age". What more can we ask for?

> Think about what you would have done if you were with Jesus 2000 years ago, walking along the road to Caesarea Philippi and Jesus turned to you and asked: "Who do men say that the Son of Man is?" What would you have answered? Would you have even been able to speak? I don't think I would have been able to answer. But His disciples did answer. Then Jesus turned and asked: "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God". And with this answer, Jesus told Peter that "you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church". Jesus knew that Peter was human and therefore weak, just as we all are, yet Jesus bestowed upon Peter the authority to be the head of the Church as we know it today. He did this by bestowing His grace upon Peter and gave him the power to overcome human weakness even though Jesus knew that Peter would betray Him three times before He was crucified.

> WE ARE ALL PETERS. We are all human and we are all the foundation of the Church. But think how much easier we have it than the disciples and early Christians. We are free to practice our faith without fear of persecution. Sometimes we are judged by others for being a Christian, but never in this country has any Christian been put in jail because of his or her religious beliefs. Maybe we should be. Maybe if it was harder to be a Christian, we would appreciate all that God has given us and continues to give us every minute of our lives. Maybe we wouldn't miss this opening day celebration and our Church would be sold out with standing-room only. Think about this and don't ever take God for granted for it is our responsibility to remain in the State of Grace so when He calls us home, we are ready to meet Him.

> So I ask that today you remember that each of us is a rock in the foundation of our Church. And by removing any part of the foundation of anything will only weaken it as time goes on. Continue to be strong as a part of our foundation so maybe some day we will have a sell-out crowd with standing room only on our opening day.



This project will provide as many of the 64,000 homeless adults and 48,000 homeless children in Chicago with basic supplies to help them as we move into colder months. Michelle plans to create Care Kits consisting of nonperishable and protein filled food, water, blankets and basic hygiene products. While it is impossible to provide every single homeless person in Chicago with these Care Kits with solely one trip into the city, Michelle plans to reach as many of them as she can. She plans to speak at all of the masses on the weekend of November 17th and 18th in order to reach out for donations for her project. They lack the basic necessities when they are stationed overseas or, are on board a ship. It's the little things we take for granted and are so readily available to us. They have no Walmart or 7-11 stores to go to.

Our hope is that these care packages will help bring a bit of home, love, and that they know, they are appreciated for their service and sacrifice; and that someone back home cares about them.

Since 2012 our parish has shipped over 3,000 boxes to our actively deployed military men and women in all branches of the military. Again, thank you for your generosity and your support!
