



GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Did you ever stop and realize that there is no earthly gain that can ever really satisfy us? Think of winning the Lotto. On this side of the winning ticket, it's all about the money, the new car, house, vacations, bank accounts, and infinite pleasures. The possibility of acquiring all of these earthly securities brings us back again and again to the purchase of a ticket. Then, one day we win! Our dreams are fulfilled, and happiness is on the horizon. Then one day, we wake up and realize that nothing has really changed, and I am not as satisfied as I thought I was or would be. I find myself living in my incompleteness and with my profound sorrow and grief. I did not find joy.

Glimpses of joy are possible but not by material means. They are brought to us through incredible experiences of connection that bring us face to face with real and authentic faith, hope, and love. And, they are glimpses and do not last. The moment we find ourselves looking back at them, they are gone, and we find ourselves remembering the moment in memory. To carry joy within us is to realize that it is not something I create, manufacture



or even acquire. It is not able to be purchased. It is a gift. My need for joy mirrors my need for eternity, for a Creator who has a claim on the very essence of who I am and desires a home within me. As C. S. Lewis discovered, joy is a surprise that speaks to my very soul and is given as gift by the God who loves me.

The beauty of Advent is found in discovering the beauty of the gift of joy. God has visited his people for no other reason than to show them where and how to find joy! All of our human and earthly joy experiences are always only glimpses. They

never satisfy us, sustain us or fulfill us. It is only God who is the joy of my soul. Real, Divine experiences of joy catch us off guard, make us stop and become aware, bring a feeling of awe and rightness and have an eternal Otherness about them. Nothing created by humans can ever come close to this. We probably will not fully realize the truth of all of this until we actually meet God face to face in heaven one day. Then, in that sacred moment when our hearts leap for joy we will understand what we have been tirelessly searching for all along. Intense gratitude will most surely follow.

ARE CATHOLICS OBLIGATED TO ATTEND MASS EACH SUNDAY, OR RECEIVE COMMUNION EACH SUNDAY?

The questions about Mass attendance and the reception of Holy Communion are clearly outlined in what are traditionally called the "Precepts" of the Church. These specific teachings are intended to stand alongside the Ten Commandments as

fundamental practices for Catholics and are outlined in the *Code of Canon Law*. The obligations related to Mass attendance and receiving Communion are outlined in the first and third precepts, which we find quoted in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (no. 2042):

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the

Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian


community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.

The third precept ("You shall receive the

sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season") guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.

Rather than seeing these as obligations that are simply to be fulfilled out of a sense of duty, Pope Saint John Paul II reminds us of the grace that is made available to us when we gather for Sunday celebrations of the Eucharist:

"Sunday is the day which is at the very heart of the Christian life... Time given to Christ is never time lost, but is rather time gained, so that our relationships and indeed our whole life may become more profoundly human" (*Dies Domini*, no. 7).

Dear Saint Francis de Sales Parish and School Family,

With this letter, I write to share some difficult news about your pastor, Father David Ryan. In keeping with our child protection policies, I have asked Father Ryan to step aside from ministry following receipt by the Archdiocese of Chicago's Archdiocesan Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review of allegations of sexual abuse of minors approximately 25 years ago while he was assigned to Maryville Academy in Des Plaines. Allegations are claims that have not been proven as true or false. Therefore, guilt or innocence should not be assumed.

Father Ryan has been directed to live away from the parish while the matter is investigated, and he is fully cooperating with this direction. Father Jerome Jacob, pastor of Saint Mary of the Annunciation in Mundelein will serve as temporary administrator of Saint Francis de Sales Parish. Father Jacob, a seasoned pastor and Dean of the area will attend to the needs of the parish and school community.

Moreover, as is required by our child protection policies, the allegations were reported to the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) and the Cook County State's Attorney. The persons making the allegations have been offered the services of our Victim Assistance Ministry and the archdiocese has begun its investigation of these matters.

In the days and weeks ahead, members of the archdiocese's Office for the Protection of Children and Youth will be available to answer any questions you may have and provide you with support during this challenging time.

It is crucial that you know nothing is more important than the welfare of the children entrusted to our care. The Archdiocese of Chicago takes all allegations of sexual misconduct seriously and encourages anyone who feels they have been sexually abused by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee to come forward. Complete information about reporting sexual abuse can be found on the Archdiocesan website at www.archchicago.org.

Please know that you are in my prayers. We will do our best to keep you informed of developments as they occur.

- Bishop Grob's comments from the 9:00 am Mass on Sunday November 29th are available online. As the bishop reminded us, and as stated in the letter from Cardinal Cupich, "Allegations are claims that have not been proven as true or false. Therefore, guilt or innocence should not be assumed."
- Bishop Grob and Father Jerry Jacob have been working closely with the parish staff to ensure Masses, including the Christmas Masses, and other sacraments continue without interruption.
 The Christmas Mass schedule will be published soon and will include outdoor Mass opportunities.
- During this time, there will likely be many different priests who are making themselves available
 to serve our parish. Please welcome them and show your appreciation for their service to our
 parish.
- The Archdiocese has assured us that Father Ryan's physical and spiritual needs are being met.
- Many people have asked about opportunities to pray together. Members of our parish staff are currently formulating a plan to gather and pray for Fr Ryan, our parish and for every person affected by this situation. Updates will be shared soon.

Respect Life & Covid-19 AT ST FRANCIS DE SALES PARISH

We continue to follow local, state and national guidelines as we ensure proper protocols and preventative measures are in place for the health and safety of everyone who enters our church.

Any individuals who are sick with or exhibiting symptoms of Covid-19 must stay home and away from others for at least ten days since their symptoms first appear and at least one day (24 hours) with no fever (without using fever reducing medications) and improved symptoms, whichever is longer. The flu season is also upon us - please remain at home if ill and attend Mass through the live streaming.

Symptoms of Covid-19 include: fever (temperature greater than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit), chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle/body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea.

If you develop symptoms of Covid-19, please contact your medical provider to discuss evaluation and testing. Of course, if you ever have severe medical issues, you should take appropriate measures to get medical help.

Existing guidelines for communion distribution

Hand Sanitizing: (please note you must sanitize your hands three times at Communion)

- Sanitize your hands before receiving Eucharist yourself
- Consume Eucharist and place face shield over face
- Sanitize your hands again
- Distribute Eucharist to congregation
- Sanitize your hands after you are finished distributing Eucharist

Distribution of Eucharist:

- Please stand at the Blue Cross on the floor in front of your section. The Green Cross mark on the floor to your right is the mark for people who use when removing their masks to consume the Eucharist
- Please watch for backups at Green Cross where people are consuming the Eucharist. And
 the backup occurs and people are not able to socially distance themselves during the
 critical time when their masks are down, please slow down or stop Distributing communion
 until the line dissipates.
- When three sides are seated, Blessed Mother side and st. Joseph sides are distributed first.
 Center section follows on Blessed Mother's side is finished
- If you finish Distributing communion in your section, and other sections already have the EM/deacon/priest, return to the altar, hand sanitize and return to your seat. Please do not help distribute communion in another section that already has someone Distributing communion, in order to avoid any crossover paths.

Thank you for taking these precautions and for your help in bringing Jesus to others.


